DAY 2 VIENNA

In the morning we will discover the city on a panoramic tour with a drive along the Ringstrasse, Vienna's main boulevard, passing by the Hofburg Palace, the Opera House, the twin museums – Fine Art History Museum and Nature History Museum, Parliament, City Hall, Votiv Church, St Charles Church, Musikverein which houses the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra and the monument of Johann Strauss, father of the Waltz. Visit of the Gardens of Belvedere Palace.

Afterwards we will continue our visit on a walking tour through the old town, which will approach us to the St Stephan's Cathedral. Mozart Residence and the old Jewish Quartier. We will end the

tour having a coffee break in a typical Viennese coffee house to enjoy a coffee accompanied by the famous Sacher Cake.

Afternoon free at leisure, where you will have the opportunity to visit the Schönbrunn Castle and enjoy a Viennese evening with a concert featuring the classical masterpieces of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Johann Strauss, two of Vienna's most famous citizens.

DAY 3 VIENNA

Breakfast buffet at the hotel. Enjoy a full day at leisure to explore Vienna by your own. As European cultural capital, Vienna offers stunning palaces, historical monuments, fascinating museums and a multicultural gastronomy, with reminiscences from the countries of the old Austrian-Hungarian Empire.

DAY 4 VIENNA - DANUBE'S VALLEY - BAD ISCHL

We start our journey to Austria departing to Dürnstein, located on the banks of the Danube River and surrounded by



historical vineyards and historical cultural monuments. We will have some free time to walk around the cozy old town before we board a boat ride on the river (May to October), which will take us to Melk, where we will visit the Benedictine abbey, a gem of the Austrian baroque architecture.

Continue of the trip to Bad Ischl, in the heart of the Lakes and Mountains District.

DAY 5 BAD ISCHL - HALLSTATT/ SALZKAMMERGUT - SALZBURG

Today we will go on the footsteps of the Imperial family visiting the Kaiservilla, wedding present from Archduchess Sophie to her son, the Emperor Franz Joseph once he got married to Sissi. We continue to the most beautiful town in Austria, Hallstatt, a picturesque village placed between the lake and the mountain and offering spectacular views to the visitor. Afterwards we head to St Wolfgang, on the shores of the St Wolfgang Lake. Have a walk through this fairy tale town before we board on a boat ride across the lake towards St. Gilgen. From St Gilgen we will continue the tour to Salzburg, passing by Mondsee to visit the church of the wedding scene in "Sound of Music" film. Arrival in Salzburg.

DAY 6 SALZBURG

Breakfast buffet at the hotel and panoramic city tour to discover Mozart's hometown, passing by Mirabell Palace, Mozarteum (the music university), Marionette Theater, Mozart's Residence, Trinity Church, Hellbrunn Palace (only outside), Nonnberg Abbey, Festival Halls, Horse Bath, Getreidegasse and Mozart Square.

Afternoon free at leisure. We suggest you to complete your stay in the city with a

visit in the Salt Mines in Hallein or at the city's beer brewery Stiegl. In the evening we will have also the opportunity to enjoy a concert with the best Mozart's pieces.

DAY 7 SALZBURG - WERFEN - ZELL AM SEE

We will admire today one of the most beautiful natural creations on our way to Zell am See, the Ice Cave in Werfen (May to October). After a cable car ride we will a walking tour inside the cave, traversing about 134 altitude meters while being astonished by the beauty of the ice sculptures and the impressive dimensions of the cave.

We continue our tour to Zell am See, one of the main ski and mountain activities resort of Austria. In the afternoon we will explore its city center, with main sites such as the Kastnerturm or Constable's Tower, the oldest building in town dating from 12th Century; the town's Parish church; the Castle Rosenberg from 16th Century and which houses today the city Hall and a gallery. Afternoon free at leisure.

DAY 8 ZELL AM SEE – KITZBÜHEL - WATTENS - INNSBRUCK

Breakfast buffet at the hotel and departure to Kitzbühel, the sports capital in the heart of the Alps which combines tradition and lifestyle as charming as any other city. It offers many possibilities for sporting activities in beautiful nature combined with a historical center with almost chic flair of doing business. Continue to Wattens, where we will visit the Chambers of Wonder at Swarovski Crystal World, where internationally and nationally recognized artists, designers, and architects have interpreted crystal in their own unique ways. They create

concepts of space and experience from the sparkling material. Arrival in Innsbruck and rest of the day free at leisure.

DAY 9 INNSBRUCK

After breakfast we will go on a walking tour through the old town. The middle Ages meet the 21st century where charming little alleys meet the broad promenade of Maria-Theresien-Straße and The Golden Roof, the Hofkirche, traditional inns and the Imperial Palace bring history to life. We will continue to Bergisel, the Olympic ski jumping site which offers us breathtaking views over the city and the mountain walls. Afternoon free at leisure.

DAY 10 INNSBRUCK – LIENZ - VILLACH - VELDEN AM WÖRTHERSEE

Today we will cross the Alps to get to Lienz, a picturesque town in East Tyrol. We will continue to Villach, where we will enjoy some free time to stroll through the old town, watching the bustle on the squares, wander through the narrow alleys and scour interesting shops before we head to Velden am Wörthersee, the Austrian Riviera and main meeting point of the local jet set.

DAY 11 VELDEN AM WÖRTHERSEE - KLAGENFURT - GRAZ

We will start the day with a boat tour on the lake Wörther, crossing it to get Klagenfurt on the opposite shore. Upon disembark we will go on a walking tour passing by its Italian palaces and cultural treasures such as the Coat of Arms Hall, the Carinthian Museum of Modern Art, the Klagenfurt City Theatre or the romantic Lendkanal, before we head to our next highlight of this tour, the Fortress of Hochosterwitz. Built between 14th and 15th Centuries on top of a hill, the fortress' main landmark are the 14 walled gates which open up to the armoury yard. We continue our to to Graz, a lively city thanks to its student population.

DAY 12 GRAZ

On our city tour we will discover the top 10 highlights of Graz, starting on a drive with the mountain railway to Schlossberg, from where we will enjoy the view over the old town as well as its main landmark, the Clock Tower. Coming down we will stroll around the cathedral of Graz or the Mausoleum nearby, the Landeszeughaus armoury and the Glockenspiel to the Mur Island, a futurist view platform on the river. Afternoon free to enjoy this pulsating city.

DAY 13 GRAZ – VIENNA

Breakfast buffet and transfer to Vienna. Arrival and day at leisure. In the evening, we will gather together for the last time with a dinner on the top of the Danube Tower.

DAY 2 VIENNA

Always associated with the imperial palaces and Sissi, Vienna is also the birthplace of the "Secession", one of the most important artistic movements of the turn of the 19th-20th centuries, which laid the foundations of Austrian modernism. Among its members are Gustav Klimt. Egon Schiele and Oskar Kokoschka the most famous. On our city tour we will visit the Belvedere Palace, now the National Art Gallery. Among its treasures we will see the masterpiece of Viennese modernism, the painting "The Kiss" by Gustav Klimt. Then we will go to the Secession building, where we will admire another of the key works of Austrian art,

"The Beethoven Frieze", in which Klimt also put images to the Ninth Symphony of the composer Ludwig von Beethoven. On the way we will see other modernist works such as the Pavilion and Houses by Otto Wagner, as well as the most outstanding buildings of the city, such as the Opera House, the Hofburg or Winter Palace, the Museum of Fine Arts and its twin Museum of Natural History, the Parliament, the Town Hall or the Votive Church, among others. We will end the tour having a coffee break in a typical Viennese coffee house to enjoy a coffee accompanied by the

DAY 4 VIENNA - DANUBE'S VALLEY - SALZBURG

Today we depart to Danube's Valley, where we find 2 of the main cultural treasures of Austria. Göttweig Abbev and Melk Abbey. Both represent the best baroque architecture of the country, being included in the World Heritage list by UNESCO since year 2.000. We will visit both abbies, which offer us unique views over the Danube river and its wineyards valley from their privileged position. Continue to Salzburg. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 5 SALZBURG

Mozart, Maria von Trapp and Stefan Zweig. Three characters that summarize the culture of Salzburg, based on music and literature. We will start our visit of the city with a guided walk through the historic center to see Mozart's birthplace and other tourist attractions such as the Horse Fountain in the Residence Square and the Salzburg Summer Festival's Theaters, all of them scenes of the movie "The Sound of Music", which reflects the life of Maria von Trapp. Then we will go to the Kapuzinerberg mountain to visit the residence of the writer Stefan Zweig between 1919 and 1934, prolific writer in whose work we find poetry, plays, essays, novels and outstanding biographies such as those of "Marie Antoinette" or "Mary Stuart" or the acclaimed "Stellar Moments of Humanity". Rest of the day at leisure.

DAY 6 SALZBURG - PALACE OF HERRENINSEL - INNSBRUCK

Departure in the morning to the German town of Prien am Chiemsee. Located on the shores of Lake Chiemsee, in the center stands the island of Herreninsel,

where King Ludwig II of Bavaria had his third and lesser known palace built. It was intended to be a smaller scale copy of the Palace of Versailles, which remained half-built after the king's untimely death. Only 7 rooms, along with the kitchen and the main staircase were completed. Visit of the palace and lunch at a lakeside restaurant with typical fish menu. Continuation of the journey to Innsbruck. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 7 INNSBRUCK

We will start the day with a walking tour of the city center, whose streets are a cross between the Middle Ages and the 21st century. The Maria-Theresia Avenue, from the Triumphal Arch to St. Anne's Column. leads us to the symbol of the city, the Golden Roof. We will visit the Imperial Palace and the Imperial Church. which will take us back to the beginnings of the Habsburg family. Free afternoon. In the evening, we will enjoy a Tyrolean dinner with the Gundolf Family accompanied by a show of dances and music to farewell our tour.

We start today our tour departing to Eisenstadt, seat of the Esterhazy Family, who was one of the wealthiest aristocratic families in Central Europe and benefactor of many artists, like the classic music composer Joseph Haydn, whom the main ball room of the palace is dedicated to. We will visit the Esterhazy Palace and will have free time to stroll around the main street.

We head to the beautiful town of Rust, on the shores of Lake Neusiedl and famous for its storks' nests, which old town was declared World Heritage by UNESCO due to perfect balance between natural life



and human action. The town's highlights are the Evangelist Church and the Fisher Church, the City Hall, the Kremayr House and the architecture set Seehof. Afterwards we continue to Graz.

DAY 4 GRAZ

On our city tour we will discover the top 10 highlights of Graz, starting on a drive with the mountain railway to Schlossberg, from where we will enjoy the view over the old town as well as its main landmark, the Clock Tower. Coming down we will stroll around the cathedral of Graz or the Mausoleum nearby, the Landeszeughaus armoury and the Glockenspiel to the Mur Island, a futurist view platform on the river. Afternoon free to enjoy this pulsating city

DAY 5 GRAZ – KLAGENFURT - VELDEN AM WÖRTHERSEE

We continue our tour to the Hochosterwitz Fortress. Built between the 14th and 15th centuries on top of a hill, the fortress' main landmark are the 14 walled gates which open up to the armoury yard. We continue to Klagenfurt for a walking tour passing by its Italian palaces and cultural treasures such as the Coat of Arms Hall, the Carinthian Museum of Modern Art, the Klagenfurt City Theatre or the romantic Lendkanal, which leads directly to Lake Wörther. There we will take a boat to cross to the opposite shore, disembarking in Velden am Wörthersee, the Austrian Riviera and meeting point of the country's jet set.

DAY 6 VELDEN AM WÖRTHERSEE – VILLACH – LIENZ

Our tour takes us to Villach, where we will enjoy free time to stroll through the old town, its squares, narrow streets

and discover interesting stores. Then we will arrive in Lienz, a picturesque East Tyrolean village. In the afternoon we will delve into the customs of East Tyrol with a workshop / fashion show of traditional costumes, which will introduce us to this fascinating textile world.

DAY 7 LIENZ - GROSSGLOCKNER - INNSBRUCK

Today we will enter Austria's highest mountain, the Grossglockner, traveling along its alpine road. Opened in 1935, this 48 km road that crosses the Hohe Tauern National Park has become an exhibition about the mountain world, its fauna and flora and offers spectacular views over the surrounding glaciers.

DAY 8 INNSBRUCK

After breakfast we will go on a walking tour through the old town. The middle Ages meet the 21st century where charming little alleys meet the broad promenade of Maria-Theresien-Straße and The Golden Roof, the Hofkirche, traditional inns and the Imperial Palace bring history to life. We will continue to Bergisel, the Olympic ski jumping site which offers us breathtaking views over the city and the mountain walls

Afternoon free at leisure. In the evening we will gather together for the last time to enjoy a farewell dinner with typical cuisine and folklore dances.

DAY 4 VIENNA - BUDAPEST

After breakfast we will depart to Hungary. Upon arrival in Budapest we will discover the city divided by the Danube River. On the one hand, the city of Buda located on top of the hill, in whose old town are the castle and the Fishermen's Bastion, from which you can admire the panoramic view.

Then we descend from the hill to discover the Pest side, the new town, passing by the Andrassy Boulevard, the Opera House, St. Stephen's Basilica, the Great Synagogue and the Heroes' Square. We finish the visit at the Great Market, where we can have a taste of typical specialties of the country. In the evening, we will enjoy a boat

ride on the river while admiring the illuminations of the city.



DAY 5 BUDAPEST

Today we will discover some of the most beautiful spots along the Danube River on this full day excursion to its bend, which hides the jewels of St. Andreas, a village of craftsmen; Visegrad, the former capital and royal residence; and Esztergom, a Catholic center with its imposing cathedral.

DAY 6 BUDAPEST

DAY 7 BUDAPEST – BRATISLAVA - PRAGUE

Going down we will reach the Mala Strana district (small town in its translation), which stands out for the narrow streets and typical buildings of the area

DAY 4 PRAGUE

DAY 5 PRAGUE - BRNO - OSTRAVA - CRACOW

We continue our tour to Poland with stops on the way in the historical Czech cities of Brno and Ostrava. Arrival in Cracow and accommodation.

DAY 6 CRACOW

Discover this dream city with a panoramic tour through the historic center, the Wawel Castle and the Rynek Glowny, the largest market square in Europe. Be thrilled in the Jewish Quarter, where up to 3 million people lived before World War II and where only 10,000 inhabitants returned after the war. Today the Jewish community has regained its cultural identity and life in the guarter again. Free afternoon. Optionally you can enjoy a visit to the salt mines of Wieliczka.

DAY 7 CRACOW - CZESTOCHOWA - WARSAW

After breakfast, we go ahead to Czestochowa, the spiritual center of the country and one of the main pilgrimage sites in Europe. We will visit the Jasna Gora Sanctuary, including the chapel and the basilica, where we will see the Black Madonna, the largest Catholic image venerated in Poland and where the Virgin Mary was declared Queen of Poland in 1657.

Continue to Warsaw, the capital of Poland. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 8 WARSAW

In the morning we will enjoy a tour around this city. Its historic center is the only center recognized as such on the UNESCO World Heritage List despite having been completely rebuilt in the years after the war.

A great deal of precision work has given Warsaw back its medieval architectural center, the main points of which are the Market Square, the ramparts, barbican and St. John's Cathedral. A bus ride will show us the most modern part of the city, the Wilanow Palace and Lazienski Park.

Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 9 WARSAW - VILNIUS

We continue our journey into the Baltic area. Arrival in Vilnius, Lithuania, and accommodation.

DAY 10 VILNIUS

Today we will discover the historic center of Vilnius, of medieval scheme and one of the best preserved in northern Europe, which earned him to enter the World Heritage List of UNESCO. Its main buildings, the Town Hall and the Palace of the Grand Dukes, are connected by Pilies Street, from which side streets emerge with their feudal palaces, churches and stores and craft workshops. Its main jewels are the Gediminas Tower, the Cathedral Square, the Gothic-style Church of St. Anne and the Martynas Mazvydas National Library, named in honor of the first Lithuanian writer to print a book in the language of the country. Afterwards, we will go ahead to Trakai Castle, located on an island in Lake Galve. An important strategic point, built between the 14th - 15th centuries, it was one of the main centers of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania. Return to Vilnius and rest of the day at leisure. Overnight in Vilnius.

DAY 11 VILNIUS - SIAULIAI - RUNDALE - RIGA

We will depart today to Latvia. Our first stop will be in Siauliai, fourth city of Lithuania, and mostly rebuilt in the 19th – 20th centuries. Highlights include the Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul, in Renaissance style, and the Villa of Chaim Frenkel, the only example of modernist art in the Baltic area. Leaving Siauliai we will visit the Hill of Crosses, so called because of the large number of crosses placed by Catholic believers throughout history. We continue to Rundale, where we will visit the palace. Built in two phases in the 18th century in baroque style, it belonged to the Dukes of Curtlandia, which today is Latvia. Today it belongs to the Latvian state and is used as a residence for state guests. Arrival in Riga and accommodation.

DAY 12 RIGA

We start the day with a visit of the Latvian capital and largest city of the 3 Baltic republics. Its historic center stands out for its modernist style, not very common in this area and for which the city was included in the list of UNESCO Heritage.

With a medieval floor plan, the center is the Market Square, where the Town Hall and the House of the Black Heads are located, dating from the 14th century and built as a meeting point for events and festivities of the city. The name derived from a brotherhood of bachelors established in the city in the 17th century. Then also highlights the Cathedral and the Church of St. Jacob; the Powder Tower, the only remnant of the city walls; the set of buildings built between the 15th -17thcenturies; and the Riga Castle, which now houses the Parliament of the country. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 13 RIGA - SIGULDA - TALLINN

Breakfast at the hotel and departure to Sigulda, northeast of Riga and located on the banks of the river Gauja. Its main attraction is the Turaida Castle. of medieval construction and recently rebuilt. Continuation to Tallinn, capital of Estonia. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 14 TALLINN

In the morning we will visit of what was once one of the main ports of trade in northern Europe during the Middle Ages, belonging to the Hanseatic League, which communicated and promoted trade between the cities of the north. Its historical center of medieval style contrasts with the Soviet-style buildings of the periphery. Its main meeting point is the Town Hall Square, with the same building with its tower of 64 meters; the pharmacy in uninterrupted service since 1442; Pikk Street in whose route are the houses of German merchants of the 15th century and the Church of St. Olaf. Of the 46 towers that protected the walls, 26 are preserved as well as almost 2 km of wall. We will astonish in front of the southern gate, called "Kiek in de Kök", and the northern gate, which bordered the beach attached to a bastion of the sixteenth century and is called "Fat Margaret" (Paks Margarita Margareeta). Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 6 BUDAPEST

DAY 7 BUDAPEST – BRATISLAVA – PRAGUE

We continue our journey to Bratislava, capital of Slovakia and located on the banks of the Danube River. After a brief stop at the castle to enjoy the view, free time to discover the small but interesting historical center of the city. Afterwards we will get on our tour to Prague. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 8 PRAGUE

DAY 10 PRAGUE - DRESDEN - BERLIN

Today we will depart towards Dresden. Arrival and city tour of this beautiful city, whose symbol is the Church of Our Lady, destroyed during the bombings of World War II and faithfully rebuilt, stone by stone, from 1994 to 2005. Discover the Semper Opera, the Zwinger Palace, the Imperial Church or the more modern buildings such as the New Synagogue, the Transparent Factory or the State Parliament of Saxony. After some free time for lunch, we will continue the trip to Berlin, Germany. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 11 BERLIN

Buffet breakfast and departure to visit the capital of Germany. Divided by the "iron curtain" during the second part of the 20th century, it had to learn again to be a city after the fall of the wall in November 1989.

During the tour we will see the Parliament, the Museum Island, St. Hedwig's Cathedral, the Nicholas district, the Holocaust Memorial and the Potsdam Square. We will cross to the west to discover the Kurfürstendamm Avenue with its elegant and aristocratic buildings, the Emperor Wilhelm Memorial Church and the KaDeWe building, the first shopping mall in Europe that opened its doors in the early 20th century. Afternoon at leisure and overnight.

DAY 12 BERLIN

Free day for personal activities or dare with one of the optional visits proposed by our guide: a rally with Trabant cars; a tour to discover the street art or "graffiti"; an excursion to the forests of the region, the Spreewald, including a canoe ride and barbecue.

DAY 4 LJUBLJANA - BLED - POSTOJNA - LJUBLJANA

hotel

Today we go on excursion to the city of Bled and Postojna caves. Located north of Ljubljana, Bled is known for the alpine lake and its island in the center, where we will visit the Church of the Assumption of the Virgin.

To reach the island we will enjoy a boat ride on the "Pletna", their typical boats. Upon arrival, we will climb the 99 steps to admire the church and its bell, whose legend says that if you make a wish while ringing the bell, it will be fulfilled. Then we will head to visit the Postojna caves, where we will make a tour aboard a little train to reach the center of the cave where we can appreciate its ghostly formations of stalactites and stalagmites that show us a beautiful spectacle. Return to Ljubljana and accommodation.

DAY 5 LJUBLJANA - ZAGREB

After breakfast we departure to Zagreb, Croatia. We will have a city tour upon our arrival through the largest city in the country and capital of the Republic of Croatia. It grew from 2 twin cities, Gradec (which was fortified against Tatar attacks in the 13th century and some of its medieval walls and porticoes still exist. It has several beautiful churches, gothic and baroque palaces) and Kaptol (where the capitals of the cathedral, decorated with complicated filigree, and the bishop's palace stand out). The pastel-painted buildings of Gradec and Kaptol contrast with the gray stone of the radial city center of Zagreb. Afternoon at leisure.

DAY 6 ZAGREB - KRK - RIJEKA

After breakfast, we will depart to the Croatian coast, where we will have the opportunity to discover one of the most spectacular natural parks in the country, the Krk National Park, which stretches along the Krka River, forming up to 7 natural waterfalls and one of the best preserved natural ecosystems in Europe. In the afternoon arrival to the town of Rijeka, in the bay of Carnaro and one of the main ports of the Austro-Hungarian Empire until 1918. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 7 RIJEKA - PLITVICE - ZADAR

We head inland to visit the Plitvice National Park, one of the most beautiful natural creations in the world, which has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We will be able to admire the quiet beauty of lakes and waterfalls that will show us an unforgettable spectacle. In the afternoon departure to Zadar. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 8 ZADAR - SIBENIK - TROGIR - SPLIT

Breakfast buffet and departure to Sibenik to visit the Cathedral of St. James, and Trogir, the best preserved Romanesque-Gothic complex in the Adriatic area and Central Europe. The medieval center includes the walls of the time, the castle with watchtower and several palaces of Romanesque, Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque styles.

Continuation of the trip to Split. Arrival and panoramic tour of the city, which will be done on foot through the old center, which stands out for its charm and the famous Diocletian's Palace.

DAY 9 SPLIT - SARAJEVO

We continue our tour to Sarajevo, capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina. Known for

the religious diversity that has coexisted here for centuries (Catholics, Orthodox, Jews and Muslims all have their place in the city), Sarajevo has attracted international attention several times in its history. From being the scene of the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand of Austria, which led to the outbreak of World War I, to hosting the Winter Olympics in 1984, to being today a city recovered and adapted to the postwar reality of the 1990s. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 10 SARAJEVO

Today we will visit the amazing capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina. Renovated after the Balkan War, the historic center once again offers the oriental-Ottoman charm of yesteryear. During the panoramic tour we will see the Bascarsija Bazaar, the Ali Pascha and Gazi-Husrev-Beg mosques, the National Theater, the Academy of Arts, the Roman-Catholic Cathedral, among other monuments. During the tour we invite you to visit the War and which served to save thousands

Tunnel of Life, built during the Balkan of lives. Afternoon free at Leisure and accommodation.

DAY 11 SARAJEVO – MEDJUGORJE - MOSTAR - DUBROVNIK

We return to Croatia visiting on the way the town of Medjugorje, an important Marian center of pilgrimages since 1981 when the image of the Virgin Mary appeared on its hill with her message of peace to those present there; and Mostar, a city that during the Ottoman Empire was a commercial center and that today we can discover visible traces of this empire visiting the old bazaar, the mosque and its famous stone bridge, rebuilt with the collaboration of the

military of the Spanish forces under NATO mandate

Arrival in Dubrovnik and overnight.

DAY 12 DUBROVNIK

After breakfast we will take a panoramic walking tour of the old city, protected by the 16th century Revelin fortress located to the east, which is only for pedestrians. Its double walls of 20 towers and bastions surround the baroque cathedral and exquisite churches, monasteries, palaces, fountains and houses with red or vellow roofs.

Dubrovnik acquired fabulous wealth from trade during the Middle Ages and was famous for its art from the 15th to 17th century.

DAY 9 IZMIR - DUBAI Breakfast at the hotel and at the appointed time, transfer to the airport to board the flight to Dubai, with a stopover in Istanbul. Arrival in Dubai and overnight.

DAY 10 DUBAI

Departure to discover the capital of one of the 7 emirates that make up the United Arab Emirates. Founded in the second half of the 18th century, Dubai was a fishing town until it became the international metropolis it is today. Afternoon at leisure to tour some of the famous shopping malls, relax on the beaches and admire the spectacle of light and color in the Palm Fountains, the largest in the world, with 1,335m², jets up to 105m high and illuminated by 3,000 LED bulbs.

DAY 11 DUBAI - Excursion to Abu Dhahi

Today we will go on an excursion to Abu Dhabi, the capital of the United Arab Emirates, Like Dubai, Abu Dhabi

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has experienced rapid growth since the 1980s, resulting in imposing modern architecture, with skyscrapers such as the Capital Plaza or the Scheich-Zayid Mosque, contrasting with traditional buildings such as the Qasr al-Husn fort and palatial residences.

Upon arrival we will take a guided tour to see the skyline on the coast and its main attractions.

art and converted into a mosque again in August 2020; the Sultan Ahmed Mosque, noted for its 6 minarets and better known as the "blue mosque" for the decoration in blue, white and green tiles; the Topkapi and Dolmabahce Palaces; the subway cistern; the Galatea Bridge and Taksim Square. Stop for lunch (included) during the visit. Free evening.

DAY 12 ISTANBUL

Free day to enjoy Istanbul in its splendor. We recommend visiting the Grand Bazaar and the Spice Bazaar, or embark on a boat trip on the Bosphorus.

DAY 13 ISTANBUL - DUBAI



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MOUNTAINS, LAKES & DESERTS / IBKDUBE

(Innsbruck - Zell am See - Salzburg - Vienna - Dubai)

DAY 1 INNSBRUCK

Arrival in Innsbruck and transfer to the hotel. In the evening we welcome you with dinner in a typical brewery.

DAY 2 INNSBRUCK - LAKE ACHENSEE - TYROLAN VILLAGES - INNSBRUCK

In the morning we leave for the town of Jenbach, where we will visit the Tratzberg Castle, a curious jewel of the Renaissance in the Alps, which is not very usual in this part of Austria. Then we will take the steam rack railway, one of the oldest still in operation in the country, to go up to Lake Achensee (May to October), the highest alpine lake in the Tyrol. A boat ride around the lake will allow us to admire the spectacular views of the mountains.

We continue the tour through the Tyrolean villages where we can discover real treasures. Our first stop will be Rattenberg, known as the "city of glass"

for the presence of several workshops that work the glass in a handmade way and where we will have free time to stroll through its medieval old town. We continue to Schwaz, where architectural wonders await us as the central nave of the parish church of the Ascension of St. Mary, from the 15th century and the largest in the Tyrolean region. We continue to Hall in Tirol, whose medieval historic center is the best preserved in the region. Highlights include the Town Hall and the church of St. Nikolaus, Gothic style. Return to Innsbruck and overnight.

DAY 3 INNSBRUCK - KITZSTEINHORN - ZELL AM SEE

In the morning, we will take a guided walk through the historic center. The Middle Ages merge into the 21st century through charming alleys, the Maria-Theresia promenade crowned by its Triumphal Arch and the Golden Roof, the Imperial Church and Palace. We will continue our



tour to the Bergisel, the Olympic diving platform where the best views of the city and the surrounding mountains await us. We will then drive to the Kitzsteinhorn Mountain, the roof of Salzburg. We will climb to the viewpoint located at over 3,000m, we will learn about the creation of glacial ice, watch an informative video about the fauna and flora of the area and enjoy the Ice Arena (Ice Arena only open in July and August).

Transfer to Zell am See, one of the main ski centers and mountain activities in Austria. Overnight stay.

DAY 4 ZELL AM SEE - WERFEN - SALZBURG

After breakfast we will take a walk through the center to see its main treasures, such as the 12th century Kastnerturm Tower, the parish church and the 14th century Rosenberg Castle, which today houses the town hall and an art gallery.

We will continue our tour to Salzburg, not without first admiring one of the most spectacular natural creations, the Werfen Ice Cave (May to October), on our way to Zell am See. After a cable car ride we will take a walking tour inside the cave, crossing about 134meters of altitude while admiring the beauty of the ice sculptures and the impressive dimensions of the cave.

Arrival in Salzburg and overnight.

DAY 5 SALZBURG - LAKES and MOUNTAINS

Breakfast buffet at the hotel and departure to discover the birthplace of Mozart, passing by the Mirabell Palace, the Mozarteum (University of Music), the Marionette Theater, Mozart's residence, the Church of the Holy Trinity, Hellbrunn

Palace, Nonnberg Abbey, the Music Festival Theaters, Getreidegasse and Mozart Square.

Then departure to the region known under the name of "Salzkammergut" (the chamber of salt goods, in translation). Area created under the Habsburg Empire to protect the salt mines and their economic benefits, covers the territory of 3 regions - Salzburg, Upper Austria and Styria - which highlights a spectacular landscape of lakes and mountains. We will visit St Gilgen, birthplace of Mozart's mother; we will take a boat trip on the lake and disembark in St Wolfgang (May to October), where we will enjoy a walking tour of this village worthy of fairy tales. Free time for lunch and continue our excursion to Hallstatt, a picturesque village located between the lake and the mountains that offers spectacular views to visitors.

It is considered the most beautiful village in Austria.

Overnight in the area of the lakes and mountains.

DAY 6 LAKES AND MOUNTAINS - DANUBE VALLEY - VIENNA

Today we leave for Melk, where stands the imposing Abbey, the best and greatest example of Austrian Baroque architecture and from which we can admire a unique view over the Danube. Free time for lunch and then we will take a boat trip (May to October) to Dürnstein. a beautiful medieval town crowned by the blue bell tower of the Augustinian church. Free time to stroll around Dürnstein. We continue to Vienna. Overnight stay.

DAY 7 VIENNA

In the morning we will go for a sightseeing tour in Vienna. Driving around the Ringstrasse we will see the most outstanding buildings of the city, such as the Opera House, the Hofburg or Winter Palace, the Museum of Fine Arts and its twin Museum of Natural History, the Parliament, the City Hall or the Votive Church, among others. Arrival in Florence and overnight.

DAY 4 FLORENCE

In the morning, we will pay a visit to the capital of Tuscany, the great center of commerce and finance in Europe during the Middle Ages.

Considered the birthplace of the Renaissance, its treasures include the Galleria dei Uffizi, the Pitti Palace, the Cathedral of Santa Maria dei Fiori and Piazza della Signora. Afternoon at leisure and overnight.

DAY 5 FLORENCE - BOLOGNA - RAVENNA - VENICE MESTRE

After breakfast we continue our journey to the educational center par excellence of Italy, Bologna, home of the oldest university in the world, and Ravenna, with eight buildings included in the UNESCO Heritage list for its magnificent mosaics of Roman and Byzantine art. In the afternoon we will arrive in Mestre.

in the surroundings of Venice, to check in our hotel.

DAY 6 MESTRE - VENICE - MESTRE

We start our day with a transfer to the island of Venice to enjoy its romanticism with St. Mark's Square and Cathedral, the Doge's Palace and the Bridge of Sighs, the canals and its narrow streets. Rest of the day at leisure before returning to the hotel.

DAY 7 MESTRE - PADUA - VERONA - MILAN

DAY 4 LEIPZIG

As a traditional European center of commerce and trade, Leipzig hosts also a musical legacy of great composers such as Johann Sebastian Bach, Richard Wagner and Felix Mendelssohn, who lived and practiced their trades here. The children's choirs of St. Thomas and the Gewandhauschor Leipzig round off the musical offer and the renown of the city. In its historic center, the highlights are St. Thomas Church, St. Nicholas Church, the Great Synagogue, Augustus Square, the Opera House and the old town hall, in Renaissance style. Free afternoon.

DAY 5 LEIPZIG – WITTENBERG - EISLEBEN - HANNOVER

We leave Leipzig and continue to Wittenberg and Eisleben, the most important cities in the life of Martin Luther. In Wittenberg we will visit the house where he lived and in Eisleben we will see the houses where he was born and died. Arrival in Hannover and accommodation.

DAY 6 HANNOVER - BREMEN

After breakfast we departure to visit Hannover, founded in the Middle Ages and commercial center related to the Hanseatic League, union of the main cities of northern Europe and Scandinavia for the exchange of products and services.

Highlights include the Kramergasse, in its historic center, with buildings from

different eras: the Town Hall of the 15th century: the market church Marktkirche. from the 14th century in Gothic style and red brick and the Herrenhausen Gardens, created in 1666.

In the afternoon we follow our tour to Bremen, Arrival and accommodation,

DAY 7 BREMEN

Today we will spend the day discovering the area of Oldenburg, Bremerhaven and Cuxhaven, the large port area of northeastern Germany.

Oldenburg is named for the first time in the 11th century, although its foundations date back to the 7th and 8th centuries. From its old medieval layout still stand out today the Degode House, a patrician house from the Middle Ages; the Gertrudenkirchhof Church, the harbor promenade, the Cecilia Bridge and the neo-Gothic and neo-Renaissance Old Town Hall, among others. Bremerhaven was built in the first half of the 19th century, with parallel and straight streets, with the intention of serving as an

entrance for large ships. It is one of the most important fishing ports in Europe as well as one of the main shipyards for the construction of ships.

Cuxhaven is one of the main fishing ports of the country as well as a tourist center of spas and sun and beach. Its symbol is the "Kugelbake", a wooden construction located in the water that marks the division between the mouth of the Elbe River and the North Sea. Return to Bremen and overnight stay.

DAY 8 BREMEN - HAMBURG

After the breakfast, we will go for a panoramic tour of Bremen, founded as a bishopric in the 8th century by Emperor

Charlemagne, becoming a center of Christianization of Western Europe. Its membership in the Hanseatic League, a commercial union of the main cities of northern Europe, makes it an important center of culture and trade. Final point of the route of German fairy tales, the highlights are the Town Hall and the figure of Roland, both included in the UNESCO; the statue of the Bremen Musicians; the streets "Bötcherstrasse" and "Schnoor". main streets of the historic center or the Bremen Cathedral.

In the afternoon, departure to Hamburg. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 9 HAMBURG

In the morning we will discover the city on a panoramic tour. It is the second most populated city in Germany after Berlin and its port is also the second most important in Europe after Rotterdam. The city is built around the artificial lakes "Binnenalster" and "Außeralster" from the river Alster that crosses the city, forming a network of canals crossed by more than 2300 bridges. Its main highlights are the avenues surrounding the lakes, with elegant buildings; the neo-Renaissance town hall; the Chile House, a stonebrick office building built in 1922 in the shape of an ocean liner; and the Elbe Philharmonic, built on the remains of the harbour's largest warehouse and whose glass façade resembles the waves of the sea. It houses up to 2.200 seats for spectators, a hotel, restaurants and private homes. Afternoon free for individual tours.

DAY 10 HAMBURG - SCHWERIN – LÜBECK – HAMBURG Full day excursion to Schwerin and

Lübeck. Schwerin is notable for the Schweriner Palace, now the seat of the regional parliament; the old town hall on the market square with a Tudor-style facade; the cathedral; the water tower and several churches, including St. Anna, the first Catholic Church built after the Reformation. Lübeck was included in the UNESCO World Heritage List for its medieval historic center of Baltic Gothic brick buildings, such as the Holsten Gate, the cathedral or St. Mary's Church. Return to Hamburg and rest of the day at leisure.

DAY 11 HAMBURG

Breakfast at the hotel and at the appointed time, transfer to Hamburg Airport.



DAY 2 FRANKFURT – ST GOAR - RÜDESHEIM - HEIDELBERG After breakfast we will depart to St Goar,

on the shores of the Rhine River and where we will embark on a boat trip to Rüdesheim while admiring the Rhine Valley, with its castles and wine terraces. Upon arrival in Rüdesheim, we will enjoy free time strolling through its medieval streets and tasting its wines. Afterwards we will continue our tour to Heidelberg, one of German historical cities. Accommodation.

DAY 3 HEIDELBERG – STRASSBURG In the morning we will go on a half-day

visit of the city, home to one of the main and oldest universities in the country,



with a medieval historic center of narrow streets dominated by the ruins of the castle. Visit of the castle including the funicular return trip. We continue our tour to Strassburg, in

France, Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 4 STRASSBURG - COLMAR - FREIBURG

Todav we will discover Alsace, a historical region disputed by France and Germany. Capital of the area, the historic center of Strassburg became part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1988, which is limited in the "Grande Ile" (large island), on the shores of the river III. Its main sightseeing include the Cathedral, made of sandstone and example of the Gothic ornaments of the 15th century; the buildings with black and white wooden facades typical of the Rhineland area: the old Town Hall of German Renaissance style; and the district of the "Petite-France", around the river III and the cathedral, composed of lively streets and squares.

We leave for Colmar, the wine capital of Alsace. Its historic center is a network of streets with medieval and Renaissance style buildings, of which the Koifhus House and the Maison Pfister are the main highlights. Free time to discover the city and its wines with a visit to some wineries in the area, with tasting. Continuation of the trip to Germany, this time crossing the Black Forest area. Arrival in Freiburg and accommodation.

DAY 5 FREIBURG – TITISEE LAKE - BASEL - LUCERNE

We leave the hotel for a visit of Freiburg, whose historic center is divided by small water channels, popularly called "Bächle" (stream in German) and in

which highlights the Gothic cathedral, the old town hall of the 16th century and the University.

Continuation to Switzerland, with a stop at Lake Titisee of glacial origin and with an area of 1.3km².

Arrival in Basel, the city of the three borders (Germany - France -Switzerland). Free time to discover its interesting historical center, with the Münster Cathedral, the historic pharmacy of the University of Basel, the Archbishopric, the "Blaues Haus" (Blue House) or the bridge across the Rhine, among others.

Continuation to Lucerne, arrival and overnight.

DAY 6 LUCERNE – ZÜRICH - SCHAFFHAUSEN - MUNICH

Breakfast at the hotel and we leave to have a guided walking tour of the historic center of Lucerne during which we can admire its symbol, the "Chapel" bridge, a covered wooden bridge of the fourteenth century.

We will then depart for Zürich, where we will enjoy a walking tour of the historic center admiring the Grossmünster Cathedral, the Le Corbusier Center, the Lindenhof and the Carolingian Imperial Palace.

We continue the tour to Munich with a stop in Schaffhausen, where we can admire the magnificent waterfalls of the Rhine River.

Arrival in Munich and accommodation.

DAY 7 MUNICH

Breakfast at the hotel and departure for a panoramic tour of the city, with the City Hall on Marienplatz, the Viktualien Markt market, the Church of Our Lady, where Pope Benedict XVI was a cardinal,

the famous Hofbräuhaus brewery, the Residence, the Old and New Pinakothek or St. Peter's Church, among other monuments. Enjoy a relaxing stroll through the gardens of Nymphenburg Palace before continuing the tour to Olympia Park and BMW World. Afternoon at leisure and overnight.

DAY 8 MUNICH

Breakfast at the hotel and at the agreed time, transfer to Munich Int. Airport.

A short walking tour will take you to see the thermal springs that spring from underground as well as the elegant buildings and parks. Continuation of the trip to Plzen, cradle of the Czech beer. Overnight stay.

DAY 4 PLZEN - CESKY BUDEJOVICE

In the morning, visit of this charming city in the heart of the Bohemian region. Different architectural styles come together to give a unique historical ensemble, such as the Gothic St. Bartholomew's Cathedral. the Renaissance Town Hall, the Great Synagogue and several Art Nouveau buildings.

Next, visit the Pilsner Urquell brewery, whose brewing method gave rise to the type of beer known as "Pilsen", in honor of the city. Discover how this beer is produced as well as the history of the brewery. At the end of the tour you will have the opportunity to taste their products in the historical cellars of the brewery.

Departure to Cesky Budejovice. Arrival and walking tour through the largest baroque style square in the country. Lodging.

DAY 5 CESKY BUDEJOVICE - CESKY **KRUMLOV - TABOR - BRNO**

After breakfast we will head for the castle of Cesky Krumlov, a small town located in the valley formed by a meander of the Vltava River. We will astonish with its medieval architecture with Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque elements, crowned by its imposing castle, which

includes a large rococo garden and the Gothic church dedicated to St. Vitus and decorated with frescoes of the 15th century.

We continue our trip to Tabor, founded in the 15th century and whose artistic heritage includes the Zizka Square, the Church of the Transfiguration, the old town hall and a group of houses with facades decorated in the Czech Renaissance style. Arrival in Brno and overnight.

DAY 6 BRNO - BRATISLAVA

We start our day with a visit the city of Brno, the second largest city in the Czech Republic. Its historical center of baroque style with the Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul, the Spilberk Fortress and the Moravian Square stands out together with the Villa Tugendhat, unique example of functionalist architecture and factories of the beginning of the industrial revolution in the country.

Then we will transfer to Bratislava, the capital of Slovakia, located on the banks of the Danube River. After a brief stop at the castle to enjoy the views, we will move to the historic center where we will follow the royal route, with the Cathedral of St. Martin, the Grassalkovich Palace, the old Town Hall, the Church of St. Elizabeth, the National Theater and the Michael's Gate. Accommodation and rest of the day at leisure.

DAY 7 BRATISLAVA - NITRA - EGER

Continuation of the trip discovering Slovakia, one of the youngest countries in Europe after its separation from the Czech Republic in 1992. We arrive in Nitra, the oldest city in the

country together with Bratislava. Its main historical attractions are the castle, from the 17th century; the cathedral of St. Emmeram, which is composed of 3 previous churches, such as the Romanesque church of the 11th century, the Gothic church of the 14th century and the upper church of the 17th century; the Pribinovo square and several bourgeois houses, among others. We continue to Eger and accommodation.

DAY 8 EGER - VISEGRAD

In the morning we will enjoy the visit of the city which highlights are the baroque old town with the cathedral and church of St. Anthony, the mosque of the Ottoman period and its minaret, the synagogue of the nineteenth century and Dobo Square. Eger is also known for its wine production. During our stay in this city we will have the opportunity to visit some wineries and have a tasting of their products. We continue to Visegrad. Overnight stay.

DAY 9 VISEGRAD - ESZTERGOM - SAINT ANDREAS - BUDAPEST

Today we will enjoy the Danube River at its best visiting 3 historical Hungarian cities: Visegrad, former historical capital and royal residence; Esztergom, Catholic center with its imposing cathedral; and St. Andreas, village of artisans. Arrival in Budapest and overnight.

DAY 10 BUDAPEST After breakfast we will discover the city divided by the Danube River. On the one hand, the city of Buda located on top of the hill, in whose old town are the castle and the Fishermen's Bastion, from which you can admire the panoramic view. Then we descend from the hill to discover the Pest side, the new town, passing by the Andrassy Boulevard, the Opera House, St. Stephen's Basilica, the Great Synagogue and the Heroes' Square. We finish the visit at the Great Market, where we can have a taste of typical specialties of the country.

In the evening, we will farewell the tour on a boat ride on the river while admiring the illuminations of the city.

DAY 11 BUDAPEST

Breakfast buffet and transfer to the airport.

DAY 4 COPENHAGEN

Panoramic tour of the capital of Denmark. On a walking tour we will discover the seafront district of Nyhavn with its typical 17th century buildings; Amagertory, the central square from the Middle Ages as well as the maze of narrow cobblestone streets around it; the Royal Palace and the Royal National Theater. Augustus Square, the Opera House and the old Town Hall, in Renaissance style. Continuation to Dresden. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 7 DRESDEN - BERLIN

After breakfast we will enjoy a tour of this beautiful city, whose symbol is the Church of Our Lady, destroyed during the bombings of the 2nd World War and faithfully rebuilt, stone by stone, from 1994 to 2005. Discover the Semper Opera, the Zwinger Palace, the Imperial Church or the more modern buildings such as the New Synagogue, the Transparent Factory or the Parliament of the State of Saxony. In the afternoon we continue to Berlin. Accommodation.

DAY 8 BERLIN

This morning we will discover the capital of Germany. Divided by the "Iron Curtain" during the second part of the 20th century, it had to learn again to be a city after the fall of the wall in November 1989. During the tour we will see the Parliament, the Museum Island, St. Hedwig's Cathedral, the Nicholas district, the Holocaust Memorial and the Potsdam Square. areas, such as the Town Hall on the Old Market Square, the imperial castle which now houses one of the first theatrical institutions of the city, the Raczynski Library, the Cathedral or the Church of the Virgin St. Mary. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 10 POZNAN - WROCLAW

We depart today to Wroclaw, also known as "The Venice of the North". Exceptional city located on the banks of the Oder River, with a university tradition and full of life. The rich history of the city is reflected in its architecture, especially in buildings such as the Cathedral, the Town Hall, the "Rynek" (main market square) and the Centennial Hall. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 11 WROCLAW - AUSCHWITZ - CRACOVIA

Leaving Wroclaw we continue to Krakow, historical capital of the country and currently the second most important city after Warsaw. On the way we will visit the Auschwitz concentration camp, a mustsee historical site. Arrival in Krakow and accommodation.

DAY 12 CRACOW

In the morning we will discover this wonderful city with a panoramic tour through the historic center, the Wawel Castle and the Rynek Glowny, the largest market square in Europe. We will be thrilled in the Jewish Quarter, where up to 3 million people lived before World War II and where only 10,000 inhabitants returned after the war. Today the Jewish community has regained its cultural identity and life in the quarter again. Free afternoon. Optionally we suggest you to enjoy a visit to the salt mines of Wieliczka.

DAY 13 CRACOW - CZESTOCHOWA - WARSAW

After breakfast, we go ahead to Czestochowa, the spiritual center of the country and one of the main pilgrimage sites in Europe. We will visit the Jasna Gora Sanctuary, including the chapel and the basilica, where we will see the Black Madonna, the largest Catholic image venerated in Poland and where the Virgin Marv was declared Queen of Poland in 1657. We continue to Warsaw, the capital of Poland. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 14 WARSAW

Breakfast and departure for a city tour. The historic center is the only center recognized as such on the UNESCO World Heritage List despite having been completely rebuilt in the years after the war. A great deal of precision work has given Warsaw back its medieval architectural center, the main points of which are the Market Square, the ramparts, barbican and St. John's Cathedral. A bus ride will show us the most modern part of the city, the Wilanow Palace and Lazienski Park. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 15 WARSAW

Breakfast at the hotel and at the agreed time, transfer to the airport.

DAY 4 LUGANO - ZERMATT

After breakfast, we will depart to Zermatt, heart of the Swiss Alps. Arrival in Zermatt and walk to the hotel. Rest of the day free to enjoy the views, hiking, etc. Overnight.

DAY 5 ZERMATT - GENEVA

Breakfast and return by train to Täsch, where the coach will pick us up to continue the journey to Geneva. Surrounding the Leman Lake we will visit the towns of Montreux, Thonon-les-Bains and Yvoire until arriving to Geneva. Lodging.

DAY 6 GENEVA – LAUSANNE - BERNE

Visit of the city on the shores of Lake Geneva and diplomatic center of Europe due to the UN and many other international organizations present in the city. In a guided walking tour of the historic center we will discover the Cathedral of St. Peter and the Chapel of the Maccabees, the Library, the Calvin College, the University and the Palais Wilson, among others. Then departure to Lausanne, Olympic capital, before arriving in Berne, capital of the country. Overnight stay.

DAY 7 BERNE

Breakfast at the hotel and departure to visit its historic center, included in the UNESCO World Heritage List, composed of small streets where we will see the symbol of the city, the "Zytlogge" (the bell of time), the "Bärengraben", the house

of Albert Einstein and the Federal Palace which houses the Swiss Parliament. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 8 BERNE - INTERLAKEN

After a short drive of just over an hour, we will arrive in Interlaken, Switzerland's mountain center par excellence. A cable car ride will take us to the Jungfraujoch Mountain, known as "the top of Europe" and whose railroad station is the highest in Europe. Free time to enjoy panoramic views of the heart of Switzerland before returning to Interlaken. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 9 INTERLAKEN - LUCERNE

This day we will continue exploring the mountains of Switzerland by climbing Mount Titlis with its exciting rotating cable car "Titlis Rotair", the 1st rotating cable car in the world that takes you from the Valley Station to the top of the mountain, 3020m above sea level. Upon arrival, we will follow the path to the glacier cave through a subway tunnel and a transparent platform with a view, holding our breath as we cross the suspension bridge! Return to the valley and continue to Lucerne. Overnight stay.

DAY 10 LUCERNE - ISLAND OF MAINAU - BREGENZ - MUNICH

Departure to Munich bordering Lake Constance. We will visit the island of Mainau, which is reached by crossing a bridge and is also known as the "Island of Flowers", for its lush and well-kept vegetation. We will continue to Bregenz, on the Austrian shore, famous for its summer opera festival, whose





performances take place on the stage located inside the lake. We arrive in Munich in the late afternoon. Overnight stay.

DAY 11 MUNICH

Breakfast at the hotel and at the agreed time, transfer to the airport.

DAY 1 DUBROVNIK

Arrival in Dubrovnik and transfer to the hotel. Accommodation.

DAY 2 DUBROVNIK

Breakfast. In the morning we will take a panoramic walking tour of the old city, protected by the 16th century Revelin fortress located to the east, which is pedestrian-only. Its double walls of 20 towers and bastions surround the baroque cathedral and exquisite churches, monasteries, palaces, fountains and houses with red or yellow roofs.

Dubrovnik acquired fabulous wealth from trade during the middle Ages and was famous for its art from the 15th – 17th century. The old city of Dubrovnik has, among its many attractions, the following monuments that we will visit: the Onofrio Fountain, the Franciscan and Dominican Monasteries, the Sponza and Rector's Palaces, and the Cathedral. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 3 DUBROVNIK - KOTOR - BUDVA

Departure to the bay of Kotor, in Montenegro, a fjord of great natural beauty. Arrival in Perast, a fishing village



where you will take a boat to reach the small island "Gospa od Skrpjela" to visit its church. Continuation to Kotor, where you will have free time to visit the historical center, and Budva, a beautiful medieval town. Overnight in Budva.

DAY 4 BUDVA - SHKODER - KRUJA - TIRANA

Breakfast and departure to Albania, the unknown Europe. Our first stop will be Shkoder, an ancient city rich in history whose wooden buildings are decorated with traditional motifs.

We continue to Kruja, where a walking tour will take us through a cobblestone path to the Ottoman Bazaar, with stores selling wooden items and antiques. Arrival in Tirana and overnight.

DAY 5 TIRANA - OHRID

In the morning we will go to a panoramic visit of the Albanian capital to see, among others, Skenderbey Square, the Ethem Bey Mosque (only on the outside, currently closed for works) and the National Museum which houses archaeological pieces that tell the history of this country.

In the afternoon, departure to Ohrid. On arrival we will enjoy the spa town, included in the list of Cultural Heritage of UNESCO and visit the Church of St. Sophia from 11th century, the most impressive monument of Macedonia. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 6 OHRID - MAVROVO - SKOPJE

Continuation of the tour to Macedonia, with a stop in the National Park of Mavrovo, where we will visit the Monastery of St. Jovan Bigorski. Continuation to Skopje, arrival and overnight.

DAY 7 SKOPJE - STOBI - THESSALONIKI City tour including the Kale Fortress, St. Savior's Church with its icons carved in walnut wood, Stone Bridge and the old Bazaar

Then departure to Stobi, south of Macedonia and bordering Greece, to visit the archaeological site of Heraclea. Arrival in Thessaloniki and overnight.

DAY 8 THESSALONIKI

Visit of the second largest city in Greece. Its artistic and cultural heritage ranges from early Christian and Byzantine monuments to Orthodox monasteries of the fourteenth century. Among the highlights are the Greek-style Arch and Rotunda of Galerius; the Roman Forum; the churches of St. Dimitrios and St. Sophia, from the 7th – 8th centuries respectively and both decorated with beautiful mosaics: the 14th century Orthodox Vlatadon Monastery, still active today; and Ottoman buildings such as the Alaca Imaret and Hamza Bey Mosques and the Pasha Hamam baths, among others.

Afterwards we will go on an excursion to Pella, hometown of Emperor Alexander the Great and capital of ancient Greece under his rule.

Today you can visit the archaeological remains of the Agora (square), the Acropolis, some "insulae", as they were known at the time the blocks of apartments.

The most interesting findings are the mosaics made with colored stones that would lay the foundations of later mosaic art.

Return to Thessaloniki and rest of the day at leisure.

Overnight in Thessaloniki.

DAY 9 THESSALONIKI – PHILIPI - KAVALA - ALEXANDROPOLIS

We follow in the footsteps of the great Greek empire visiting the archaeological ruins of Philipi, founded by King Philip II of Macedonia. Archaeological excavations have brought to light the remains of the theater, forum, 2 basilicas, baths and part of the walls. After the IIWW, the episcopal guarter of the Octagon and 3 more basilicas, two of them in the necropolis,

were discovered. Continuation to Kavala, the main port of the Macedonian and Thracian area, which makes it a strategic point of trade relations. Founded by settlers from the island of Thasos, it was occupied by the Romans and the Ottoman Empire from 1371 to 1912. The aqueduct of Suleiman the Magnificent and the birthplace of Mehmet Ali, Pasha of Egypt in 1805, remain from this period. Arrival in Alexandropolis and overnight.

DAY 10 ALEXANDROPOLIS - ISTANBUL

Departure after breakfast for Turkey. Arrival in Istanbul and visit of this exciting city, meeting point of the West and the East. Let yourself be carried away by history through Hagia Sophia, Catholic cathedral during the rule of the Byzantine Emperor Justinian I; the Blue Mosque, designed with 6 minarets and a striking tiled interior: the Grand Bazaar and the Spice Bazaar; the Sinan Mosque, decorated with tiles; the subway cistern used as a basilica and of course, the Topkapi Palace. Overnight stay.

DAY 11 ISTANBUL Breakfast and free day for personal activities or any of the optional activities,

such as a boat trip on the Bosphorus, the visit of the Topkapi Palace or the Dolmabahce Palace. Overnight stay.

DAY 12 ISTANBUL

Breakfast and at the agreed time, transfer to the airport.

DAY 3 DUBROVNIK - KOTOR -**BUDVA – DUBROVNIK**

Breakfast and departure to Kotor, a city of exceptional universal value for the



quality of its architecture. We will visit the old town and the cathedral of St. Tryphon. Continuation to Budva. On a walking tour through the old town we will admire its Venetian architecture and its churches, such as those dedicated to St. Ivan, St. Mary and the Holy Trinity. Late afternoon we drive back to Dubrovnik. Accommodation.

DAY 4 DUBROVNIK - MOSTAR

We continue our tour heading to Mostar. After lunch, we will start the walking tour of the old town, during which we will see the Bishop's building, the Turkish public bath (Hamman), the clock tower. the Karadjoz-Beg mosque, the Ottoman residences, the Crooked bridge and the Tara and Halebija towers. Overnight in Mostar

DAY 5 MOSTAR-SARAJEVO-MOSTAR

Today we depart to Sarajevo. Arrival and visit of the old town, which houses the most important religious sites of the city, such as the Old Orthodox Church of Sarajevo, the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart and the Gazi Husrev-beg Mosque. Visit of the Tunnel of Life. Free afternoon in Sarajevo. Return to Mostar.

DAY 6 MOSTAR - SPLIT

Departure to Split. During the panoramic tour of the city we explore the Diocletian's Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, with its peristyle, the Temple of Jupiter and the Cathedral. The walking tour will feature the highlights of the city, including the Cathedral and the Bell Tower of St. Dominic, the statue of Gregory the Nin, the Golden Gate, the

Town Clock and the Town Hall building. Overnight in Split.

DAY 7 SPLIT - TROGIR - PLITVICE

After breakfast, we depart to Plitvice. stopping on the way in Trogir, whose medieval center of Romanesque-Gothic style reflects the mixture of Greek, Roman and Venetian cultures. Continue to Plitvice National Park for overnight.

DAY 8 PLITVICE – ZAGREB

We will enjoy a visit to the spectacular Plitvice Lakes National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Embraced by high forested mountains, you will find up to sixteen beautiful lakes with crystal clear blue-green water. Afternoon departure to Zagreb for overnight stay.

DAY 9 ZAGREB

After breakfast, visit of this historic city including St. Mark's Church, St. Catherine's Church, the Cathedral, the Parliament and the Government Palace. Afternoon at leisure.

DAY 10 ZAGREB - POSTOJNA – LJUBLJANA

Today we head to the Postojna Caves in Slovenia. A fantastic tour through tunnels, passages, galleries and halls, the amazing karst landscape and its easy access are undoubtedly the main reasons for such popularity of the cave. Continuation to Ljubljana. In the city center we will visit the picturesque openair central market, the baroque town hall, the triple bridge, the Robba fountain and the Parliament building. Overnight in Ljubljana

DAY 11 LJUBLJANA - BLED - LJUBLJANA

Full day excursion to Bled, the charming lakeside town with its imposing castle perched on a cliff. On a ride in the typical "pletna" boats we will reach the island in the center of the lake where the beautiful Gothic church stands on the foundations of a temple dedicated to the ancient Slavic goddess of love Živa. Free time for lunch and return to Ljubljana.

DAY 12 LJUBLJANA - TRIESTE - VENICE MESTRE

Leaving Ljubljana we head to Trieste, Italy, for an orientation tour and visit the Miramar Castle. The castle was built by the Habsburg monarchy on a cliff overlooking the Adriatic Sea. We continue to the romantic city of Venice. Dinner and overnight in Venice or surroundings.

DAY 13 VENICE MESTRE

Venice is our next destination, a citv immortalized in literature, film and art for centuries. Its timeless waterways and artistic masterpieces make it truly unique. Your guide will introduce you to the city on an orientation walk, during which you will see the famous St. Mark's Square, the Grand Canal and the Rialto Bridge. The rest of the afternoon is yours to explore this unforgettable city on your own. Don't miss the opportunity to take a gondola and water cab to explore Venice from the water.

DAY 14 VENICE After breakfast, transfer to the airport at the appointed time.

DAY 5 THE HAGUE - GOUDA - ROTTERDAM



We continue to Breda, conquered by the troops of Philip II in 1581 and immortalized in the great canvas of Diego de Velázquez, "The Surrender of Breda". Free time to admire the Beguinage, buildings belonging to religious communities that integrate not only the dwellings and monastic facilities, but also the workshops, very popular



in the regions of Holland and Flanders; and the Main Church, an example of Brabantine Gothic. Continuation to Antwerp, Belgium. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 4 ANTWERP - BRUGES

Known for its diamond industry and trade, monuments such as the Church of St. James, the Renaissance town hall, the Cathedral of Our Lady which houses 4 works of the painter Rubens, and the Grote Markt are their main highlights. Continuation of the tour to Bruges. Arrival and guided walk through the historic center of one of the most beautiful cities in Europe. Its old town, declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 2000, stands out for the maintenance of the original structures, although most of it has been rebuilt. During the guided tour, discover its main tourist attractions, such as the Belfort bell tower, the St. Boniface Bridge, the town hall and the Provincial Palace, among others. Overnight stay.

DAY 5 BRUGES - GHENT - BRUSSELS

After breakfast, departure to Ghent. Free time to visit the Cathedral of St. Bavo and stroll through its historic center. Continuation of the tour to Brussels. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 6 BRUSSELS

Breakfast and panoramic tour of the capital of Belgium and headquarters of the European Union and NATO, among other international organizations. Discover the Grande Place, the nerve center of the city and a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1988, where the

Gothic Town Hall building stands out. The tour continues to the Atomium monument, the Manneken Pis statue, the Royal Palace and the buildings of the European Union, among others. Free afternoon and overnight.


DAY 7 BRUSSELS - REIMS - PARIS

century, which has a unique shade of blue in the world.

Continuation to Orleans, scene of the coronation of French kings in the middle Ages. Its historic center is dominated by a statue dedicated to Joan of Arc, who led the French troops against the English army during the attacks of the Hundred Years' War, and the late Gothic Cathedral of the Holv Cross. Arrival in Tours and overnight.

DAY 4 TOURS - LOIRE CHATEAUX - NANTES

Visit of the city of Tours, historical capital of France under the reign of Louis XI and starting point to visit the famous Loire Castles.

Leaving Tours we approach the castles of Chenonceau and Azay le Rideau. From the 16thcentury, Chenonceau is surrounded by a water moat and its grounds include several gardens, a park and a plantation dedicated to the cultivation of vines. Azay le Rideau began its construction in the 15thcentury and is one of the most popular castles in the area. Arrival in Nantes, gateway to Brittany, and overnight.

DAY 5 NANTES - CARNAC - BREST

Breakfast and visit of Nantes to see the roval square, the cathedral of St. Peter and Paul and the castle of the Grand Dukes of Brittany. We will then head to the region of Brittany, whose Celtic origins are still visible today. Stop in Carnac where the famous Forest of Carnac is located, supposedly the meeting point of the Celtic druids and whose prehistoric site with up to 3000 menhirs placed in single file is the largest in the world. Arrival in Brest and overnight.

DAY 6 BREST - PERROS GUIREC - SAINT BRIEUC - SAINT MALO

Discover this port city that served as a military fort throughout history. Its ramparts, the Tanguy Tower, the castle and the Siam Street are its main attractions. On the way to Saint Malo we will discover the fascinating Breton coast, with fishing villages, steep cliffs and medieval heritage.

DAY 7 SAINT MALO - RENNES - SAINT MALO

Excursion to Rennes, capital of the Brittany region. Take a stroll through its 16th century historic center, with its narrow streets lined with half-timbered buildings; two main squares, both dating from the 17th century, where the Town Hall, the Opera House and the Parliament of Brittany are located: the Basilica of St. Sauveur and the Cathedral of St. Peter, among other monuments. Free time to enjoy the city and return to Saint Malo.

Rest of the day at leisure, it is recommended to walk along the seafront along the ramparts surrounding the old town.

DAY 8 SAINT MALO - MOUNT ST MICHEL - CHERBOURG - CAEN

After breakfast, visit of Mont St Michel. which marks the border between Brittany and Normandy. Member of the UNESCO World Heritage, its Benedictine abbey dedicated to St. Michel has become a pilgrimage site as well as a tourist attraction. Gothic in style and modified throughout history, the main attraction of this mountain is to become an island every time the tide rises. We continue the tour to Cherbourg and Caen, two of the main scenes of the

landing of Normandy and its battles against the German troops. Overnight in Caen.

DAY 9 CAEN - LE HAVRE - ROUEN

Breakfast and brief tour of Caen to see its main attractions, such as the castle of William the Conqueror and the abbeys of St. Stephen and Holy Trinity, known as the Abbev of Men (St. Stephen) and the Abbey of Women (Holy Trinity). Departure then to Le Havre, located on the banks of the Seine River delta. Largely destroyed by the attacks of the 2nd World War, the center was rebuilt in the second half of the 20th century, its Gothic and Renaissance cathedral was saved.

We continue to Rouen, baptized as the "City of a hundred bell towers" by Victor Hugo, and center of the French Gothic style. 

DAY 8 LODZ - CZESTOCHOWA - CRACOW

After breakfast, we go ahead to Czestochowa, the spiritual center of the country and one of the main pilorimage sites in Europe. We will visit the Jasna Gora Sanctuary, including the chapel and the basilica, where we will see the Black Madonna, the largest Catholic image venerated in Poland and where the Virgin Mary was declared Queen of Poland in 1657.

Continue to Cracow, Poland's historic capital. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 9 CRACOW

Discover this dream city with a panoramic tour through the historic center, the Wawel Castle and the Rynek Glowny, the largest market square in Europe. We continue then to Zakopane, center of the Tatra Mountains. Arrival and rest of the day free for personal activities.

DAY 11 ZAKOPANE - RZESZOW – LUBLIN

We continue our trip to Rzeszow, one of the most elite cities in the country, with a large number of investments, rapid progress and a high standard of living. Its historic center, with the Market Square, its churches and synagogues, is one of the best preserved in Poland. We continue to Lublin, meeting point between East and West. Overnight in Lublin

DAY 12 LUBLIN - WARSAW

In the morning, we will visit the old town, quite well preserved despite the fact that the city was not spared from the attacks during the 2nd World War. Its main sights are the Town Hall, the Grand Hotel Lublinianka, the Crown Court and the Lublin Castle, whose chapel dedicated to the Holy Trinity is frescoed

with a mixture of Catholic and Russian-Byzantine motifs. In the afternoon, we will have the transfer

back to Warsaw. Accommodation.

THE SILVER ROUTE / SILVERSPAIN

(Madrid - Gijón - León - Zamora - Salamanca - Cáceres - Mérida - Seville)

DAY 1 MADRID

Arrival in Madrid and transfer to the hotel.

DAY 2 MADRID - BURGOS - GIJON We start today our trip departing to the north of Spain, with a first stop in Burgos, historic capital of the Kingdom of Castile and whose important historicalarchitectural legacy has earned it to be included in the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Its main monuments are the Cathedral of Santa Maria, one of the best examples of Spanish Gothic; the Monastery of Santa Maria la Real de Las Huelgas, of the Cistercian order and the Carthusian Monastery of Santa Maria de Miraflores, a monastic complex in Gothic style that houses the tombs of the parents and brother of Queen Isabella the Catholic.

Continuation to Gijón. Upon arrival, we will go on a walk through the historic center to know the neighborhood of Cimadevilla, the oldest part of the city,

which has archaeological remains from Roman times, such as the walls and the baths, as well as became the most important port of the city. During our walk we will see the Palace of Revillagigedo and the Collegiate Church of San Juan Bautista, the Jovellanos Birthplace Museum, the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Contrueces, the Church of San Pedro and the Town Hall of Gijón, among other monuments.

In the evening, enjoy a visit to a cider house where we will learn the secrets of the national drink of Asturias, cider, while tasting a typical menu.

DAY 3 GIJON - RIBADESELLA - CANGAS DE ONIS - COVADONGA - GIJON

The full day excursion of today will get us to know Asturias, taking us to such emblematic sites as Ribadesella, founded by Alfonso X the Wise and one of the main ports of the region in the 19th



century; Cangas de Onís, the historical capital of Asturias and Covadonga. epicenter of the Picos de Europa National Park

During the visit we will visit a Cabrales cheese factory. Return to Gijón and accommodation.

DAY 4 GIJON - AVILES - OVIEDO - LEON

After breakfast we start our journey to Seville following the ancient Ruta de la Plata (the Silver Route) an important Roman road that connected the north with the south.

Our first stop will be Aviles, the third city of Asturias. Its historic center composed of several palaces, noble houses, churches and squares ranging from Romanesque style to modernism have earned it to be classified as an area of tourist interest

Free time to discover the city individually and continue the trip to Oviedo, capital of the region. It stands out for its heritage built in Asturian pre-Romanesque style, which dates back to the 9th - 10th centuries and has been declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. Among them emerge the Church of Santa Maria del Naranco, the Holy Chamber of Oviedo or the Testero of San Tirso, among others. Finally, transfer to León and accommodation.

DAY 5 LEON

Today in the morning we will enjoy a panoramic tour around one of the historic cities of Spain. Born as a military camp during the Roman occupation, it reached its fame when it became the head of the Kingdom of León, one of the founder kingdoms in the creation of the Kingdom of Spain. It was here where the first Courts of Europe were held in 1188.

under the reign of Alfonso IX. Within its great artistic heritage include the Cathedral, the best example of French Gothic in the country; the Basilica of San Isidoro, considered the Sistine Chapel of Romanesque art: the Monastery of San Marcos, the first example of Plateresque art and Spanish Renaissance; the Palaces of Los Guzmanes and the Counts of Luna; the Church of the Market: the Church of Palat del Rey or the Casa Botines, from the modernist architect Antoni Gaudi, all of them declared of Cultural Interest. Free afternoon to finish discovering the city on our own.

DAY 6 LEON - ASTORGA - ZAMORA

Departure to Astorga, an ancient Roman military camp from the end of the 1st century BC and converted into one of the oldest dioceses in the country. It was one of the most important communication hubs in the northern region, with a strong industrial and commercial development and driven by the Camino de Santiago. We will wonder its historical-artistic heritage, headed by the Episcopal Palace, the Cathedral, the Town Hall and the Roman ruins, of which we can still see the Baths, the remains of the forum and the ergastula (vaulted construction). After some free time to enjoy the city we will continue our trip to Zamora, where we will stay for overnight.

DAY 7 ZAMORA - SALAMANCA

In the morning we will enjoy a visit of Zamora, in whose old town we will admire the set of Romanesque buildings consisting of 23 temples and 14 churches; the cathedral with dome decorated with scales, the castle, walls and a set of 19 modernist buildings, the most extensive in the interior of the country. In the afternoon, we depart to Salamanca. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 8 SALAMANCA

Breakfast at the hotel and departure for a visit to one of the most emblematic cities in Spain, home to the oldest university in the country founded in 1218 by Alfonso IX of León and one of the most prestigious educative centers in Europe during the Middle Ages. The historic center is part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1988, with highlights as the two cathedrals - the Old and the New -, the Casa de las Conchas, the Plaza Mayor, the convent of San Esteban and the Escuelas Mayores. Rest of the day at leisure.

DAY 9 SALAMANCA - BÉJAR - PLASENCIA - CÁCERES

Today we continue our tour to Extremadura passing through the towns of Béjar and Plasencia. The historic center of Béjar, a medieval village, was declared a historic-artistic

site for its popular mountain architecture, the medieval wall that surrounds it and the Park of El Bosque, one of the few examples of Italian Renaissance style gardens preserved in Spain, built in the 16th century by the Dukes of Béjar. It served then as a recreational villa and its decorative elements (such as the pond, the statues, the palace and the kiosk) were remodeled in the 19th century. Marked by the Silver Route, Plasencia was founded by King Alfonso VIII of Castile in 1186 as a strategic military point. It offers a historical-monumental ensemble declared of cultural interest in which the Cathedral of Santa Maria, the Carvaial-Giron Palace and the Mirabel Palace are the main monuments. Two cathedrals (the Old one from the 13th - 14th centuries and the New one from the end of the 15thcentury), the walls with 7 entrance gates, several civil palaces and 4 medieval hospitals round off the cultural offer of the city. After this visit we continue the circuit to Cáceres. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 10 CÁCERES - TRUJILLO

- GUADALUPE - MÉRIDA In the morning we will join for a panoramic tour of Cáceres, declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1986 for being one of the most complete medieval and Renaissance urban complexes in the world. We will wonder the Co-cathedral of Santa Maria, the Palacio de las Veletas, the palaces of the Golfines, the Casa del Sol, the Torre de Bujaco and the Arco de la Estrella.

We continue our journey to Trujillo, founded as a Roman settlement and developing to a medieval city, but most well-known as the cradle of conquerors, such as Francisco Pizarro and Francisco de Orellana, the latter discoverer of the Amazon River.

Its historical heritage includes the Castle, an ancient Arab fortress, the 13th century Church of Santa Maria la Mayor and the palaces of the Plaza Mayor. To these are added its exquisite gastronomy and its natural environment. We leave Trujillo and approach Guadalupe to admire its splendid Monastery of Santa Maria de Guadalupe, from the 13th century and whose interior shows Gothic, Mudejar, Renaissance, Barogue and Neoclassical styles. We continue to Merida, capital of the region of Extremadura. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 11 MÉRIDA - ZAFRA - SEVILLE

Founded as a Roman colony in 25 BC by Emperor Octavian Augustus, it was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO for its splendid archaeological site, mainly for the monuments of the Roman period, such as the Theater, the Amphitheater, the circus, the bridges over the Guadiana and Albarregas Rivers, the aqueduct and the Arch of Trajan, among

others

The Cathedral of Santa Maria de lerusalem, the Cauliana Monastery and the Arab Alcazaba; the Palaces of Vera-Mendoza and Corbo, the Real Edificio de la Carniceria and the Co-cathedral of Santa Maria or the Basilica of Santa Eulalia, complete the historic center of the citv.

Afterwards, we will depart to Zafra, one of the main cattle breeding points of the region and Spain in general. Border of the Taifa kingdoms of Seville and Badaioz, it was reconquered twice, passing into the hands of Gomes I Suarez de Figueroa in 1394. From here, his descendants made it the epicenter of the Lordship of Feria. building the walls and the Alcazar. We continue to Seville, last stop of the Silver Route.

Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 12 SEVILLE

Today we will enjoy a discovering tour of the capital of Andalusia. Its extensive history, from the Romans to the present, has left an important cultural legacy in its heritage, being able to join various styles such as Gothic, Mudejar, Renaissance and Baroque, among others. The main sightseeing of the city, included

in the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites, are the Cathedral, the Giralda, the Alcazar and the Archive of the Indies. The Cathedral of Seville is the largest Gothic cathedral in the world, whose construction began in 1433 under the canons of the Gothic style. By the end of its construction, elements of Renaissance, Baroque, academic and neo-Gothic style had been added to the building. The most famous part of the building is, without doubt, the bell tower, popularly known as La Giralda. Its construction began in the 12th century as an Almohad minaret of the old mosque, becoming a Catholic bell tower in later centuries.

We continue the visit to the Alcazar, the oldest active roval palace in Europe: the Archivo de Indias, the Plaza de España, Torre del Oro and the Palacio de las Dueñas - property of the House of Alba-, among other monuments. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 13 SEVILLE

After breakfast at the hotel and at the agreed time, transfer to the airport.

Panoramic tour of the capital of Spain passing by the Royal Palace, Retiro Park, Paseo de la Castellana, Puerta de Alcalá, Plaza del Sol, Prado Museum and Moncloa Palace. Afternoon at leisure and overnight.

DAY 3 MADRID - TOLEDO - CIUDAD **REAL - CORDOBA**

Breakfast and departure to Toledo, in Castilla La Mancha and historical capital of Spain. On a guided walking tour discover the legacy of the three cultures - Muslim, Jewish and Christian - that earned it the status of Historic-Artistic Heritage in 1940 and its inclusion in the UNESCO World Heritage List. The Alcázar de Toleado, former royal

palace, as well as the Monastery of San Juan de los Reyes, an outstanding example of Elizabethan Gothic; the Church of Santo Tomé, which houses the painting of "The Burial of the Count of Orgaz" by El Greco; the walls and the different entrance gates, among other monuments, make this city an architectural and cultural iewel. Continuation of the tour to Ciudad Real. with free time for individual walks, and arrival in Cordoba. Overnight stay.

DAY 4 CÓRDOBA - SEVILLA

Panoramic tour of the historical capital of the Caliphate of Cordoba, making it one of the most cultured and prosperous cities of medieval Europe. These traces can be followed in the Mosque-Cathedral and all the old Jewish guarter, around which extends the historic center. highlighting the streets of Flores and Pañuelo. From its Roman origins we can observe the Bridge over the Guadalquivir River, the Roman Temple, the theater and amphitheater and the mausoleum, among



other monuments.

Free time to enjoy the city and in the afternoon, departure to Seville. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 5 SEVILLE

Panoramic tour of the capital of Andalusia, the fourth largest city in Spain after Madrid, Barcelona and Valencia, Its extensive history, from the Romans to the present, has left an important cultural legacy in its heritage, being able to observe various styles such as Gothic, Mudejar, Renaissance and Baroque, among others. Its buildings included in the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites stand out: the Cathedral, the Giralda, the Alcazar and the Archive of the Indies. The Cathedral of Seville is the largest Gothic cathedral in the world, whose construction began in 1433 under the canons of the Gothic style. Later additions and decorations added Renaissance, Baroque, academic and neo-Gothic elements to the building. Of the building stands out, without doubt, the bell tower, popularly known as La Giralda. Its construction began in the 12th century as an Almohad laminar of the old mosque, becoming a Catholic bell tower in later centuries.

We continue the visit to the Alcazar, the oldest active royal palace in Europe; the Archivo de Indias, the Plaza de España. Torre del Oro and the Palacio de las Dueñas - property of the House of Alba-, among other monuments. Rest of the day at leisure and accommodation.

DAY 6 SEVILLA - CADIZ - MARBELLA

After breakfast departure to Cadiz, known as the "Tacita de Plata" and scene of the first Spanish constitution, promulgated in 1812. Walk through the historic center

to see the Plaza Mendizábal, the Tavira Tower, the neoclassical and Elizabethan style Town Hall and the Oratory of San Felipe Neri, among other monuments. Free time to enjoy the city before continuing the tour to Marbella. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 7 MARBELLA - MALAGA - GRANADA

We continue the itinerary to Malaga, founded by the Phoenicians and converted into a powerful Mediterranean port by the Romans and Arabs, which has a historic center of irregular layout, an Arab heritage, in which 19th century buildings coexist with the Roman Theater, the Alcazaba or the Jewish guarter. Continuation to Granada, the pearl of Andalusia, whose main attraction is the Alhambra Palace. Initiated as a defensive fortification, it became a palace-cazaba for the Nasrid dynasty of Muhammad I in the 13thcentury. With the passage of time and different rulers, the structure underwent several modifications, the most important being those carried out under the reign of Charles I, in the midsixteenth century. Inside the building are the Puerta de la Justicia, the Alcazaba, the royal palaces, the Sala de los Mocárabes, the Sala de los Reyes and the Patio de los Leones. Continuing with the visit we enter the gardens of the Generalife, a set of a palace with several gardens, promenades and viewpoints that invited to rest. Rest of the day at leisure and accommodation.

DAY 8 GRANADA - VALENCIA

Breakfast at the hotel and departure to the Valencian Community. Arrival in Valencia and visit of this Mediterranean city founded by the Romans and whose heyday came in the 15th century. From this period date the main symbols of the city as the bell tower of the cathedral, affectionately called "Miguelete"; the towers of the Serranos and the Lonja de la Seda. We will also pass by the Gothic temple of Santa Catalina Mártir; the Real Parroquia de los Santos Juanes, with a baroque interior; the Monastery of San Miguel de los Reves, the main example of Valencian Renaissance; the Estación del Norte and the Casa consistorial, both modernist examples. We finish the visit with the most modern side of the city, which includes works by Santiago Calatrava such as the 9 de Octubre Bridge and the City of Arts and Sciences.

Rest of the day at leisure and accommodation.

DAY 9 VALENCIA - EBRO DELTA - TARRAGONA - BARCELONA

Departure to the Ebro Delta, natural border between the communities of Valencia and Catalonia. Natural habitat of a bird life rich in variety and quantity, it has become one of the main ornithological observation stations in Europe. The inland area has extensive areas of rice fields while the part near the sea is formed by large lagoons, marshes and dunes.

We continue to Tarragona, one of the main cities of the peninsula under the rule of the Roman Empire. During the visit of the city we can see the rich heritage of this era, such as the amphitheater and the circus, the forum surrounded by the wall, the ancient audience and the Tower of the Scipios. Free time to enjoy the city and continuation of the trip to Barcelona. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 10 BARCELONA

After breakfast we will start the guided tour with a walking tour of the historic center, also known as the Gothic Quarter for the presence of multiple examples of this style. Highlights include the Palace of the Generalitat (seat of the regional government) and the City Hall, both buildings located face to face; the cathedral and Casa de la Pia Almoina, a charitable center of the 11th century and restored in the 15thcentury; the Church of Santa Maria del Pi, better known as the church of the pine tree by the presence of this tree in front; the royal shipyards, an example of Gothic civil architecture; and of course, the Church of Santa Maria del Mar, considered the real cathedral by the citizens of Barcelona, built by the people in the mid-14th century.

We continue on a bus tour to admire the main jewels of Catalan Modernism, such as Casa Milà or Casa Batlló, the Hospital de Sant Pau or the Palace of Music; and to climb to Montjuic, scene of the 1992 Olympics and from where you get the best views over the city and the sea. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 11 BARCELONA

Breakfast at the hotel and at the agreed time, transfer to the airport.

DAY 1 BILBAO

Arrival in Bilbao and transfer to the hotel.

DAY 2 BILBAO

Panoramic tour of the city founded in the 13th century and converted into one of the main commercial ports of the country during the 19th – 20th centuries. Its historic center turns around the streets Somera, Artecalle and Tendería, near which stands the cathedral of Santiago Apostle, Gothic style and built between the 14th – 15th centuries. Other points of interest are the Basilica of Our Lady of Begoña, patron saint of the city and the provincial one; the 19thcentury eclectic style City Hall, as well as the Chávarri Palace, current seat of the sub delegation of the civil government, and the Palace of the Floral Deputation; the Campos Elíseos Theater, considered a jewel of the Basque modernist style and of course,

the Guggenheim Museum, opened in 1997 and designed by architect Frank O. Gehry resembling a ship leaving the estuary. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 3 BILBAO - SANTANDER - SANTILLANA DEL MAR - COMILLAS - GIJON

We will travel along the Cantabrian coast to Gijon, in Asturias, visiting Santander, spa and summer resort of the Spanish court and aristocracy in the 19th – 20th centuries, highlighting the beaches of El Sardinero and the Palacio de la Magdalena; and Santillana del Mar. Considered one of the most beautiful towns in Spain, the Collegiate Church of the 12th century in a historic center formed by stone buildings from the 14th -17th centuries.

Then we arrive at the town of Comillas.



which highlights its medieval and baroque buildings, as well as for being the artistic scene of modernist artists such as Gaudí and Domènech i Montaner. Gaudí's Capricho Palace, commissioned by the Marguis of Comillas to the Catalan architect, stands out.

Arrival in Gijón and accommodation.

DAY 4 GIJÓN - A CORUÑA

After breakfast, a walk through the historic center will take us to know the neighborhood of Cimadevilla, the oldest part of the city, which has archaeological remains from Roman times, such as the walls and the baths, as well as became the most important port of the city. During our tour we will see the Palace of Revillagigedo and the Collegiate Church of San Juan Bautista, the Jovellanos Birthplace Museum, the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Contrueces, the Church of San Pedro and the Town Hall of Gijón, among other monuments.

Departure to A Coruña, in the region of Galicia. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 5 A CORUÑA - SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA

Visit one of the most industrialized cities in Galicia, historically the most important port. Main highlihts of the city are its symbol, the Tower of Hercules, of unknown origin but already present in Roman times and remodeled in later centuries. The current facade is of neoclassical style and UNESCO recognized it as a World Heritage Site in 2007. Next we will see the Castle of San Antón, from the 16th century and built to defend the city from maritime attacks, especially the attacks of the English navy in 1589; the Romanesque collegiate church of Santa Maria; the

baroque church of San Jorge, among other monuments. In a walking tour we will enjoy the promenade; the old city and the "galleries".

In the afternoon, departure to Santiago de Compostela. Upon arrival, visit the Cathedral consecrated to the Apostle Santiago, pilgrimage destination for hosting, according to tradition, the sarcophagus of the apostle. Here ends the Camino de Santiago, a route that connected Europe with the Iberian Peninsula following the trail of the Milky Way. Built on the foundations of a first pre-Romanesque church, the present cathedral was begun in 1075 under the reign of King Alfonso VI, and was finished in the 12th century when the Pórtico de la Gloria and the crypt were added. The cathedral underwent extensions and was again decorated between the 16th - 18th centuries. It is at this time that the Obradoiro Facade was built, whose main motive was to protect the Pórtico de la Gloria from deterioration. Currently, this facade is the best known of the cathedral and has become the symbol of the city. Rest of the day at leisure and accommodation.

DAY 6 SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA - PONTEVEDRA - VIGO - BRAGA - PORTO

Departure after breakfast to the other outstanding cities of Galicia, Pontevedra and Vigo. On the way we will have the opportunity to visit some Albariño wine cellars and have a wine tasting. Arrival in Braga, our first stop in Portugal, for a guided walking tour through the historic center following the traces of its foundation in the Neolithic period, highlighting the cathedral, the Town Hall, the Sanctuary of Bom Jesus do Monte or the Monastery in Mire de Tibaes, among others. Continuation to Porto, arrival and accommodation.

DAY 7 OPORTO

Breakfast and panoramic visit of the 2nd most important city of Portugal, on the banks of the Douro River and the Atlantic Ocean. With a historic center of extensive artistic heritage listed by UNESCO. highlights include the Palacio de la Bolsa, the cathedral of Romanesque origin, the church and Tower of the Clerics of baroque and Rococo style, the latter being the symbol of the city, among others.

Then we will enjoy a boat ride on the Duero River from which we will be able to contemplate the magnificent bridges that cross it. We will finish the visit in a Port wine cellar, with tasting. Rest of the day at leisure. Lodging.

DAY 8 PORTO - COIMBRA - LISBON

Departure to Coimbra, cradle of Portuguese kings and the first University of Portugal, which makes it a renowned student city. Of Roman origin, its center attracts with its narrow streets, courtyards, stairways and medieval arches.

Free time to enjoy the city and continuation of the trip to Lisbon, the capital of the country. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 9 LISBON

Panoramic tour of the city located at the mouth of the Tajo River, where monuments such as the Tower of Belem and the Castle of St. George stand out; the cathedral of the 12th century and a mixture of various styles due to successive renovations or the monastery of Jerónimos, in the district of Belem and Manueline style, Portuguese own style developed under the mandate of King Manuel I of Portugal and which is a variation of the final Portuguese Gothic to which are added elements of Portuguese-Mudejar style, own iconography and decorations of the Italian Renaissance. A walking tour will take us to the Alfama district, the oldest of the city and whose best views are obtained from the viewpoints of Porta do Sol and Santa Luzia.

Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 10 LISBON

After breakfast departure for the excursion to Sintra and Cascais. historical cities around Lisbon. While Sintra stood out as a summer resort of the Portuguese royalty, which left a great legacy of castles, palaces and mansions, Cascais stood out as a small fishing port that attracted the nobility in summer times, providing it with beautiful residences of the 19th century. Return to Lisbon and rest of the day at

leisure. Overnight.

DAY 11 LISBON

After breakfast at the hotel and at the agreed time, transfer to the airport.

DAY 1 BUCHAREST

Arrival in Bucharest and transfer to the hotel. Accommodation.

DAY 2 BUCHAREST – RUSE – VELIKO TARNOVO

Breakfast and panoramic tour of the city during which we will admire the Parliament, the second largest building in the city with more than 1000 rooms and one of the best examples of communist architecture; the Patriarchate, seat of the head of the Orthodox Church: the Romanian Athenaeum, considered a symbol of Romanian culture; the National

Museum of Art; the Arc de Triomphe, built in 1935 in the image and likeness of the Parisian Arc, among other monuments. Afterwards, departure to Veliko Tarnovo, in Bulgaria, with a stop in Ruse for border formalities. Overnight stay.

DAY 3 VELIKO TARNOVO -**KAZANLAK - PLOVDIV**

Visit of the ancient historical capital of Bulgaria, starting at the Tsarevets fortress, located on the hill of the same name, and seat of the royal and patriarchal palace. The complex consists of 3.6m high walls and three gates, the Royal Palace, the



Patriarchate, the Baldwin Tower and the Asenova Gate.

We then return to the centre of Veliko Tarnovo where we will have a short walk to discover the House of the Monkey, the Church of Saints Kirill and Methodil, the Samovodska Charshiya Bazaar and the Sarfkina House, among others. Afterwards we drive to Kazanlak in the Vallev of Roses to visit the Thracian Tomb from the 4th century BC. A unique monument of this period and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, it is part of an important necropolis of the Thracian period, where more than 1000 tombs of kings and aristocratic members of the Thracian society can be found. The tomb consists of a narrow corridor and a round burial chamber, decorated with frescoes depicting various moments of life. Arrival in Plovdiv and overnight.

DAY 4 PLOVDIV - DOBARSKO - RILA - SOFIA

Departure to Dobarsko, where the most interesting frescoes of the country can be found. The frescoes of the Church of Theodore Tyro and Theodore Stratelates, from the beginning of the 17th century, present the main donors (Bogdan, Hasiya and his son) as well as the builders Spas, Stanko and Smilen and Jesus. The 19th century frescoes in the Church of the Purification of the Virgin depict the Bulgarian National Awakening, the period of economic and cultural development of the Bulgarian nation under the rule of the Ottoman Empire.

We continue our journey to the Rila Monastery. Founded in the first half of the 10th century, the Rila Monastery became the main spiritual, educational and cultural centre of the country. Arrival in Sofia and overnight.

DAY 5 SOFIA - BELOGRADCHICK

Breakfast and panoramic city tour including the city walls, churches and ancient streets built during the Byzantine era. Today the center of Sofia is a combination of Western styles such as Neo-Rococo, Neo-Renaissance and Neoclassicism, including the Church of St. Sophia; the Alexander Nevsky Cathedral, one of the largest Orthodox churches in the world; the Boyana Church; the Ivan Vazov National Theatre, among other monuments. Then departure to Belogradchick. On arrival, visit of its fortress and the incredible landscape that the rock formations of the area draw. Overnight stav.

DAY 6 BELOGRADCHICK - CRAIOVA - COZIA - SIBIU

Today we say goodbye to Bulgaria and return to Romania. The first stop on the way will be Craiova, whose life revolves around its beautiful Town Hall, the Cathedral of St. Demetrios, the Church of the Monastery of Cosuna and the Baniei House, among others.

We continue to Cozia, where we can admire the 14th century Monastery dedicated to the Holy Trinity. It houses the tomb of Mircea I of Wallachia and is one of the most outstanding monuments of the medieval period, as well as being the only Byzantine-style monastery in Romania still standing. Arrival in Sibiu and accommodation.

DAY 7 SIBIU - SIGHISOARA - BRASOV

After breakfast, visit of what is probably the most beautiful city in the country. Founded in the 12th century by the German Saxons, much of its architecture is of German influence. Its historic center, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, consists of the Lower Town, with long, wide streets and rustic-style architecture with double-storey houses and the oldest church in the city; and the Upper Town, which has grown up around the Big Square and is home to major buildings such as the Bruckenthal Palace, the Jesuit Church and the Council Tower. The Small Square closes the Upper Town with a network of small, narrow alleys, including the Liar's Bridge and the Holy Trinity Cathedral.

Finally there is the Huet Square, whose main attraction is the Evangelical Lutheran Cathedral, Gothic-style buildings and the Staircase Alley, which leads to the Lower Town.

Continuation of the tour to Sighisoara, situated in the Transvlvanian Carpathian Mountains, Included in the UNESCO World Heritage List, its historic centre has managed to preserve its fortified medieval layout, in which the Citadel, the Clock Tower and the cemetery stand out. Short visit on arrival with free time to enjoy the city on your own and then transfer to Brasov.

Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 8 BRASOV - BRAN - PELES - SINAIA - BUCHAREST

Breakfast and departure to Bran, where the most famous castle in Romania is located as the setting of the novel "Dracula" by Bram Stoker. The novel is based on the real character of Prince Vlad III, who fought against the Ottoman Empire and was famous for his cruelty in punishing his enemies. Continuation to Peles Castle, built between 1873 and 1917 and former summer residence of the Romanian royal

family, and Sinaia, where we will visit the Sinaia Monastery, founded in the 17th century by Prince Mihail Cantacuzino in honor of the monastery of St. Catherine of Mount Sinai (Egypt).

Arrival in Bucharest and accommodation.

DAY 9 BUCHAREST

Breakfast at the hotel and transfer to the airport.

Package includes:

DAY 1 ROME

Arrival at Rome airport and transfer to hotel.

DAY 2 ROME

Breakfast at the hotel and transfer to the historic center of Rome, where you will start the walking tour following the traces of the ancient Roman Empire, such as the Colosseum, the Pantheon, the Traian Column and the Roman Forum. After a leap in time we will see the Renaissance and Baroque styles represented in most of the palaces of the city, such as the Quirinale, Venezia or Farnese and in the most famous squares such as the Spanish Steps, Navona or della Minerva. We continue with a coach tour around other points of interest such as the Church of Santa Maria Maggiore, the Vatican, Piazza Venezia, the Basilica of San Giovanni in Laterano and the Baths

of Caracalla, among others. Afternoon at leisure and overnight.

DAY 3 ROME - NAPLES

Today we depart en route to Naples, the great city of southern Italy.

Upon arrival we will visit its historic center. included in the UNESCO World Heritage List for its rich heritage, heritage of Greeks, Romans, Byzantines, French and Spanish

Highlights include the 7 defensive castles that surround it; the Royal Palace, the Basilica of San Francesco di Paola and the Cathedral, Piazza Plesbicito, Via Toledo and the Umberto I Galleries. Rest of the day at leisure to enjoy this city. Overnight stay.

DAY 4 NAPLES - POMPEII - SORRENTO Departure to the ruins of Pompeii, Roman city destroyed in 79 by the eruption of



the volcano Vesuvius. It was buried under the lava and ash that it expelled, thus preserving its original layout, buildings and objects, and we can now know how the cities were organized in Roman times. During the visit we will be able to see the forum and the amphitheater, the basilica and several temples, as well as private houses decorated with mosaics or the baths.

Then we will go to some volcanic wine cellars, where we will visit their facilities and taste their wines with lunch included. In the afternoon we will arrive in Sorrento, where we will embark on a boat to watch the sunset from the sea. Return to Sorrento and overnight.

DAY 5 SORRENTO - AMALFI COAST - SALERNO

We continue our journey along the beautiful Amalfi coast, which offers exceptional views and landscapes. On the way we will visit its main towns, Positano, Amalfi and Ravello, among which are artistic treasures such as the Church of Santa Maria Assunta in Positano; the 13th century Cathedral with an imposing mosaic on its facade in Amalfi; and the Rufolo and Cimbrone Villas in Ravello. Arrival in Salerno and overnight.

DAY 6 SALERNO - BARI - Ferry to Greece

Early departure from Salerno to cross Italy towards the Adriatic Sea. Upon arrival in Bari, panoramic tour of the capital of the Apulia region and main port in the south of the country. Among its treasures are the Petruzzelli Theater, the Cathedral of San Sabino, the Basilica of San Nicola and the Piazza del Ferrarese. Free time to enjoy the city and at the

appointed time, transfer to the port to board the overnight ferry to Igoumenitsa, Greece. Overnight on board.

DAY 7 IGOUMENITSA - IOANNINA - METEORA MONASTERIES - KALAMBAKA

Arrival at 05:30 am in Igoumenitsa and transfer to a local restaurant or hotel to eniov a good breakfast. Once we have regained strength, we will continue the journey to Ioannina, of Byzantine origin and whose splendor came in the fifteenth century when it came under Turkish rule. From this period are its main treasures in the historic center, such as the citadel that includes the mosque of Aslan Aga, the Turkish library and the ancient synagogue, the Fetihié mosque and the former royal palace; and the Cathedral of St. Athanasius.

We will then head to the famous Meteora Monasteries, built on top of rock formations and inhabited continuously since the 15th century. In total there are 6 monasteries, dedicated to St. Nicholas, St. Stephen, Holy Trinity, Great Meteora, Roussanou and Varlaam. All of them belong to the UNESCO World Heritage List and are open to the public, who are subject to a strict dress code to enter (no cleavage, you must be covered, women can not wear pants, only skirts). After this visit we will arrive to Kalambaka and rest of the day at leisure. Lodging.

DAY 8 KALAMBAKA - DELPHI -ATHENS

Today we continue our tour to the capital of Greece, Athens. On the way we will visit Delphi, where the Temple of Apollo was located. Among its historical treasures are the stadium, the Temple of Athena and the walls. Inside the Temple

of Apollo are the Treasury of Athens, the theater and the great altar. After the visit we will continue to Athens, where we will arrive in the afternoon. Overnight stay.

DAY 9 ATHENS

In the morning we will visit the cradle of Western democracy, with a guided tour starting at the Panathenaic Stadium. where the first Olympic Games were held. We will continue through the Temple of Olympian Zeus, the University, the Academy and the National Library to reach the Parliament, the Catholic Cathedral, Constitution Square and the Russian Orthodox Church. Finally we will climb the Acropolis Hill to admire the Parthenon, the Portico of the Maidens and the Temple of Athena, among other aems.

In the afternoon, we will transfer to Cape Sounion, approx. 1.5 hours south of Athens, to enjoy the spectacular sunset. Return to Athens and overnight.

DAY 10 ATHENS - Excursion to Epidaurus, Nafplios & Mycenae

Today's excursion will take us to visit the main archaeological sites of the country. First we will arrive at Epidaurus, which highlights its theater of the fourth century B.C. Its proportions give it an exceptional acoustics, known throughout the world. Its perfect state of preservation allows it to host theatrical performances even today

We will then arrive in Nafplios, where we will enjoy free time for lunch and stroll through its charming historic center, where the 3 fortresses, the Church of St Spiridonas or the Station Park stand out. After lunch we will visit Mycenae, whose treasures include the Gate of the Lions,


the Tomb of Atreus, the walls, the royal palace and the circle of tombs. Return to Athens and overnight.

DAY 11 ATHENS

Breakfast at the hotel and at the indicated time, transfer to the airport.

DAY 1 STOCKHOLM

DAY 2 STOCKHOLM

Breakfast and visit of the city, considered the pearl of Scandinavia. On a walking tour you will discover the center of the Gamla Stan district, considered the seed of the city; the City Hall where the Nobel Prize ceremony takes place; the Vasa Museum which houses the only ship of the seventeenth century practically intact; the Royal Palace and the Djurgärdsbron

Bridge.

Afternoon free for individual sightseeing.

DAY 3 STOCKHOLM

In the morning free time until transfer to the port of Stockholm, where we will board the overnight ferry to Helsinki, Finland.

DAY 4 HELSINKI

Breakfast on board. Arrival at the port of Helsinki and meeting with the local guide who will take us on a tour of the historical center of the city to learn about its history



and its main monuments, such as the National Theater, the Market Square, the Temppeliaukio Church, the Uspenski Cathedral and the National Opera House. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 5 HELSINKI - TURKU - TAMPERE

Departure after breakfast to Turku, once the most important city in the country and now a major center of culture in the country. It hosts the Turku Music Festival and the "Ruisrock" Rock Festival, the oldest in the Scandinavian world, as well as the only music museum in the country, the Sibelius Museum. In its medieval historic center highlights the Cathedral of the fifteenth century, the Main Square where the old Town Hall is located; the castle of the thirteenth century and several civil buildings of the nineteenth century.

We will continue to Tampere, the 3rd city of the country. In a short walking tour through the historic center we will see the most famous open-air theater in Finland; the early 20th century cathedral built in blue-gray granite; the Russian Orthodox Church and the Old Church, from 1824 made of yellow wood, and finally the Särkänniemi Park. Rest of the day at leisure to enjoy the city and overnight.

DAY 6 TAMPERE - OULU

Today we will continue our journey north, arriving in the city of Oulu. Overnight in Oulu.

DAY 7 OULU - ROVANIEMI

In past centuries an important center of the timber industry and salmon fishing,

Oulu is now home to major Finnish technology companies and a renowned spa center. We will start the day with a visit to the open-air Turkansaari Museum. which houses up to 27 historic wooden buildings; continuing towards the center we will see the Orthodox Cathedral of the Holy Trinity; the neo-Renaissance Town Hall from 1886 and the Cathedral-Church of Sofia Magdalena from the XVII-XVIII centuries.

We will then head north, arriving in Rovaniemi, gateway to the Arctic Circle and residence of Santa Claus. Upon arrival, free time for lunch and in the afternoon, visit of our Christmas friend's house and certified Arctic crossing. Transfer to the hotel where we will stay for the next 3 nights and overnight.

DAY 8 ROVANIEMI - Activity day

First day in Rovaniemi to enjoy one of the following activities, depending on the season:

SUMMER and AUTUMN (June to September).

Visit reindeer and husky dog farms - see first-hand two iconic animals of the area, reindeer and huskies. Learn about their breeding and domestication, and their lifestvles.

Canoeing in the midnight sun - ever wanted to know what it's like to have sunlight at 12:00 midnight? In Lapland's summer you can experience it and at the same time have a fun time canoeing on one of the many Finnish lakes.

Forest trekking tour - trekking tour in the

Taiga forest around Rovaniemi where the guide will explain about the fauna and flora of the area and teach you how to make a fire without matches!

WINTER and SPRING (October to April) Reindeer Safari - take a reindeer sleigh ride through the magnificent Lapland scenery.

Aurora Borealis - a snowmobile tour in pursuit of the spectacular Northern Lights with their brilliant colors. Ice fishing - learn the ancient Finnish techniques of how to fish on a frozen lake.

DAY 9 ROVANIEMI - Activity Day Second day of fun activities:

SUMMER and AUTUMN (June to September). Floating on ice - experience a unique feeling of entering a frozen lake and

at night.

Rafting on the Arctic River - the instructor will brief you on rafting and lifesaving techniques before starting the river route from which you can enjoy the unique scenerv.

WINTER and SPRING (October to April)

Arctic sauna - relax in the snow in an Arctic sauna, one of the most appreciated meeting points of the Lappish society.

Snowshoeing tour - a more relaxed but equally spectacular activity crossing

floating on it while the sun is still shining

snowy forests and frozen lakes.

The last night we will enjoy a farewell dinner with a typical menu of the area. Overnight.

DAY 10 ROVANIEMI

Breakfast at the hotel and at the indicated time, transfer to the airport.

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DAY 1 VIENNA

Arrival at Vienna Int. Airport and transfer to the hotel.

DAY 2 VIENNA

In the morning we will go for a sightseeing tour in Vienna. Driving around the Ringstrasse we will see the most outstanding buildings of the city, such as the Opera House, the Hofburg or Winter Palace, the Museum of Fine Arts and its twin Museum of Natural History, the Parliament, the City Hall or the Votive Church, among others. We will continue with a pleasant walking tour through the center that will take us to St. Stephen's Cathedral, the narrow

streets of the Jewish quarter, the house where Mozart lived or the Danube Canal, an area of street artists. We will finish the visit with one of the

most Viennese customs: having a coffee with a Sacher cake at one of popular coffee houses. Afternoon at leisure and overnight in Vienna.

DAY 3 VIENNA – PRAGUE

After having breakfast at the hotel we will depart to Prague, capital of the Czech Republic.

In the afternoon, we will visit the city starting in the castle district, located up on a hill. Its main highlights are St. Vitus Cathedral, the Royal Palace, St. George's Chapel and the Golden Street. Going down we will reach the Mala Strana district (small town in its translation), which stands out for the narrow streets and typical buildings of the area

This leads us to the Charles Bridge, from



which we will admire breathtaking views of the city while it takes us to the historic center to visit the Astronomical Clock, the Jewish Quarter, Wenceslas Square, among other monuments. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 4 PRAGUE

Free day for personal activities or take a beer tour (optional) or try a cooking course.

DAY 5 PRAGUE - BRNO - OSTRAVA - CRACOW

We continue our tour to Poland with stops on the way in the historical Czech cities of Brno and Ostrava. Arrival in Cracow and accommodation.

DAY 6 CRACOW

Discover this dream city with a panoramic tour through the historic center, the Wawel Castle and the Rynek Glowny, the largest market square in Europe. Be thrilled in the Jewish Quarter, where up to 3 million people lived before World War II and where only 10,000 inhabitants returned after the war. Today the Jewish community has regained its cultural identity and life in the quarter again. Free afternoon. Optionally you can enjoy a visit to the salt mines of Wieliczka.

DAY 7 CRACOW - CZESTOCHOWA - WARSAW

After breakfast, we go ahead to Czestochowa, the spiritual center of the country and one of the main pilgrimage sites in Europe. We will visit the Jasna Gora Sanctuary, including the chapel and the basilica, where we will see the Black Madonna, the largest Catholic image venerated in Poland and where the Virgin Mary was declared Queen of Poland in 1657.

Continue to Warsaw, the capital of Poland. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 8 WARSAW

In the morning we will enjoy a tour around this city. Its historic center is the only center recognized as such on the UNESCO World Heritage List despite having been completely rebuilt in the years after the war.

A great deal of precision work has given Warsaw back its medieval architectural center, the main points of which are the Market Square, the ramparts, barbican and St. John's Cathedral. A bus ride will show us the most modern part of the city, the Wilanow Palace and Lazienski Park.

Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 9 WARSAW - VILNIUS

We continue our journey into the Baltic area. Arrival in Vilnius, Lithuania, and accommodation.

DAY 10 VILNIUS

Today we will discover the historic center of Vilnius, of medieval scheme and one of the best preserved in northern Europe, which earned him to enter the World Heritage List of UNESCO. Its main buildings, the Town Hall and the Palace of the Grand Dukes, are connected by Pilies Street, from which side streets emerge with their feudal palaces, churches and stores and craft workshops. Its main jewels are the Gediminas Tower, the Cathedral Square, the Gothic-style Church of St. Anne and the Martynas Mazvydas National Library, named in honor of the first Lithuanian writer to print a book in the language of the country. Afterwards, we will go ahead to Trakai Castle, located on an island in Lake Galve. An important strategic point, built between the 14th - 15th centuries, it was one of the main centers of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania. Return to Vilnius and rest of the day at leisure. Overnight in Vilnius.

- RUNDALE - RIGA

We will depart today to Latvia. Our first stop will be in Siauliai, fourth city of Lithuania, and mostly rebuilt in the 19th – 20th centuries. Highlights include the Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul, in Renaissance style, and the Villa of Chaim Frenkel, the only example of modernist art in the Baltic area. Leaving Siauliai we will visit the Hill of Crosses, so called because of the large number of crosses placed by Catholic believers throughout history. We continue to Rundale, where we will visit the palace. Built in two phases in the 18th century in baroque style, it belonged to the Dukes of Curtlandia, which today is Latvia. Today it belongs to the Latvian state and is used as a residence for state guests. Arrival in Riga and accommodation.

DAY 12 RIGA

We start the day with a visit of the Latvian capital and largest city of the 3 Baltic republics. Its historic center stands out for its modernist style, not very common in this area and for which the city was included in the list of UNESCO Heritage.

With a medieval floor plan, the center is the Market Square, where the Town Hall and the House of the Black Heads are located, dating from the 14th century and built as a meeting point for events and festivities of the city. The name derived from a brotherhood of bachelors established in the city in the 17th century. Then also highlights the Cathedral and the Church of St. Jacob; the Powder Tower, the only remnant of the city walls; the set of buildings built between the 15th -17thcenturies; and the Riga Castle, which now houses the Parliament of the country. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 11 VILNIUS - SIAULIAI

DAY 13 RIGA - SIGULDA - TALLINN

Breakfast at the hotel and departure to Sigulda, northeast of Riga and located on the banks of the river Gauja. Its main attraction is the Turaida Castle. of medieval construction and recently rebuilt. Continuation to Tallinn, capital of Estonia. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 14 TALLINN

In the morning we will visit of what was once one of the main ports of trade in northern Europe during the Middle Ages, belonging to the Hanseatic League, which communicated and promoted trade between the cities of the north. Its historical center of medieval style contrasts with the Soviet-style buildings of the periphery. Its main meeting point is the Town Hall Square, with the same building with its tower of 64 meters; the pharmacy in uninterrupted service since 1442; Pikk Street in whose route are the houses of German merchants of the 15th century and the Church of St. Olaf. Of the 46 towers that protected the walls, 26 are preserved as well as almost 2 km of wall. We will astonish in front of the southern gate, called "Kiek in de Kök", and the northern gate, which bordered the beach attached to a bastion of the sixteenth century and is called "Fat Margaret" (Paks Margarita Margareeta). Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 1 VILNIUS

Arrival at the airport of Vilnius, meet & greet with the driver and transfer to the hotel. Accommodation.

DAY 2 VILNIUS

Today we will discover the historic center of Vilnius, of medieval scheme and one of the best preserved in northern Europe, which earned him to enter the World Heritage List of UNESCO. Its main buildings, the Town Hall and the Palace of the Grand Dukes, are connected by Pilies Street, from which side streets emerge with their feudal palaces, churches and stores and craft workshops. Its main iewels are the Gediminas Tower, the Cathedral Square, the Gothic-style Church of St. Anne and the Martynas Mazvydas National Library, named in honor of the first Lithuanian

writer to print a book in the language of the country. Afterwards, we will go ahead to Trakai Castle, located on an island in Lake Galve. An important strategic point, built between the 14th – 15th centuries, it was one of the main centers of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania.

Return to Vilnius and rest of the day at leisure. Overnight in Vilnius.

DAY 6 TALLINN

DAY 7 TALLINN After breakfast transfer to the airport at the appointed time.



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DAY 1 DUBROVNIK

Arrival in Dubrovnik and transfer to the hotel. Accommodation.

DAY 2 DUBROVNIK

Breakfast. In the morning we will take a panoramic walking tour of the old city, protected by the 16th century Revelin fortress located to the east, which is pedestrian-only. Its double walls of 20 towers and bastions surround the baroque cathedral and exquisite churches, monasteries, palaces, fountains and houses with red or yellow roofs.

Dubrovnik acquired fabulous wealth from trade during the middle Ages and was famous for its art from the 15th – 17th century. The old city of Dubrovnik has, among its many attractions, the following monuments that we will visit: the Onofrio Fountain, the Franciscan and Dominican Monasteries, the Sponza and Rector's Palaces, and the Cathedral. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 3 DUBROVNIK - KOTOR - BUDVA

Departure to the bay of Kotor, in Montenegro, a fjord of great natural beauty. Arrival in Perast, a fishing village



where you will take a boat to reach the small island "Gospa od Skrpjela" to visit its church. Continuation to Kotor, where you will have free time to visit the historical center, and Budva, a beautiful medieval town. Overnight in Budva.

DAY 4 BUDVA - SHKODER - KRUJA - TIRANA

Breakfast and departure to Albania, the unknown Europe. Our first stop will be Shkoder, an ancient city rich in history whose wooden buildings are decorated with traditional motifs.

We continue to Kruja, where a walking tour will take us through a cobblestone path to the Ottoman Bazaar, with stores selling wooden items and antiques. Arrival in Tirana and overnight.

DAY 5 TIRANA - OHRID

In the morning we will go to a panoramic visit of the Albanian capital to see, among others, Skenderbey Square, the Ethem Bey Mosque (only on the outside, currently closed for works) and the National Museum which houses archaeological pieces that tell the history of this country.

In the afternoon, departure to Ohrid. On arrival we will enjoy the spa town, included in the list of Cultural Heritage of UNESCO and visit the Church of St. Sophia from 11th century, the most impressive monument of Macedonia. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 6 OHRID - MAVROVO - SKOPJE

Continuation of the tour to Macedonia, with a stop in the National Park of Mavrovo, where we will visit the Monastery of St. Jovan Bigorski. Continuation to Skopje, arrival and overnight.

DAY 7 SKOPJE - STOBI - THESSALONIKI City tour including the Kale Fortress, St. Savior's Church with its icons carved in walnut wood, Stone Bridge and the old Bazaar

Then departure to Stobi, south of Macedonia and bordering Greece, to visit the archaeological site of Heraclea. Arrival in Thessaloniki and overnight.

DAY 8 THESSALONIKI

Visit of the second largest city in Greece. Its artistic and cultural heritage ranges from early Christian and Byzantine monuments to Orthodox monasteries of the fourteenth century. Among the highlights are the Greek-style Arch and Rotunda of Galerius; the Roman Forum; the churches of St. Dimitrios and St. Sophia, from the 7th – 8th centuries respectively and both decorated with beautiful mosaics: the 14th century Orthodox Vlatadon Monastery, still active today; and Ottoman buildings such as the Alaca Imaret and Hamza Bey Mosques and the Pasha Hamam baths, among others.

Afterwards we will go on an excursion to Pella, hometown of Emperor Alexander the Great and capital of ancient Greece under his rule.

Today you can visit the archaeological remains of the Agora (square), the Acropolis, some "insulae", as they were known at the time the blocks of apartments.

The most interesting findings are the mosaics made with colored stones that would lay the foundations of later mosaic art.

Return to Thessaloniki and rest of the day at leisure.

Overnight in Thessaloniki.

DAY 9 THESSALONIKI – PHILIPI - KAVALA - ALEXANDROPOLIS

We follow in the footsteps of the great Greek empire visiting the archaeological ruins of Philipi, founded by King Philip II of Macedonia. Archaeological excavations have brought to light the remains of the theater, forum, 2 basilicas, baths and part of the walls. After the IIWW, the episcopal guarter of the Octagon and 3 more basilicas, two of them in the necropolis,

were discovered. Continuation to Kavala, the main port of the Macedonian and Thracian area, which makes it a strategic point of trade relations. Founded by settlers from the island of Thasos, it was occupied by the Romans and the Ottoman Empire from 1371 to 1912. The aqueduct of Suleiman the Magnificent and the birthplace of Mehmet Ali, Pasha of Egypt in 1805, remain from this period. Arrival in Alexandropolis and overnight.

DAY 10 ALEXANDROPOLIS - ISTANBUL

Departure after breakfast for Turkey. Arrival in Istanbul and visit of this exciting city, meeting point of the West and the East. Let yourself be carried away by history through Hagia Sophia, Catholic cathedral during the rule of the Byzantine Emperor Justinian I; the Blue Mosque, designed with 6 minarets and a striking tiled interior: the Grand Bazaar and the Spice Bazaar; the Sinan Mosque, decorated with tiles; the subway cistern used as a basilica and of course, the Topkapi Palace. Overnight stay.

DAY 11 ISTANBUL

Breakfast and free day for personal activities or any of the optional activities, such as a boat trip on the Bosphorus,

the visit of the Topkapi Palace or the Dolmabahce Palace. Overnight stay.

DAY 12 ISTANBUL

Breakfast and at the agreed time, transfer to the airport.

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


DAY 1 DUBROVNIK

Arrival at the airport and meeting with our guide and transfer to the hotel. Overnight in Dubrovnik

DAY 2 DUBROVNIK

We start our day with a city tour around the charming medieval city of Dubrovnik, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, also





DAY 3 DUBROVNIK - KOTOR - BUDVA - DUBROVNIK

Breakfast and departure to Kotor, a city of exceptional universal value for the quality of its architecture. We will visit the old town and the cathedral of St. Tryphon. Continuation to Budva. On a walking tour through the old town we will admire its Venetian architecture and its churches, such as those dedicated to St. Ivan, St. Mary and the Holy Trinity. Late afternoon we drive back to Dubrovnik. Accommodation.

DAY 4 DUBROVNIK - MOSTAR

We continue our tour heading to Mostar. After lunch, we will start the walking tour of the old town, during which we will see the Bishop's building, the Turkish public bath (Hamman), the clock tower, the Karadjoz-Beg mosque, the Ottoman residences, the Crooked bridge and the Tara and Halebija towers. Overnight in Mostar

DAY 5 MOSTAR-SARAJEVO-MOSTAR

Today we depart to Sarajevo. Arrival and visit of the old town, which houses the most important religious sites of the city, such as the Old Orthodox Church of Sarajevo, the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart and the Gazi Husrev-beg Mosque. Visit of the Tunnel of Life. Free afternoon in Saraievo, Return to Mostar.

DAY 6 MOSTAR - SPLIT

Departure to Split. During the panoramic tour of the city we explore the Diocletian's Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, with its peristyle, the Temple of Jupiter and the Cathedral. The walking tour will feature the highlights of the city, including

the Cathedral and the Bell Tower of St. Dominic, the statue of Gregory the Nin, the Golden Gate, the Town Clock and the Town Hall building. Overnight in Split.

DAY 7 SPLIT – TROGIR – PLITVICE

After breakfast, we depart to Plitvice. stopping on the way in Trogir, whose medieval center of Romanesque-Gothic style reflects the mixture of Greek, Roman and Venetian cultures. Continue to Plitvice National Park for overnight.

DAY 8 PLITVICE - ZAGREB

We will enjoy a visit to the spectacular Plitvice Lakes National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Embraced by high forested mountains, you will find up to sixteen beautiful lakes with crystal clear blue-green water. Afternoon departure to Zagreb for overnight stay.

DAY 9 ZAGREB

After breakfast, visit of this historic city including St. Mark's Church. St. Catherine's Church, the Cathedral, the Parliament and the Government Palace. Afternoon at leisure.

DAY 10 ZAGREB - POSTOJNA – LJUBLJANA

Today we head to the Postojna Caves in Slovenia. A fantastic tour through tunnels. passages, galleries and halls, the amazing karst landscape and its easy access are undoubtedly the main reasons for such popularity of the cave. Continuation to Ljubljana. In the city center we will visit the picturesque open-air central market, the baroque town hall, the triple bridge, the Robba fountain and the Parliament building. Overnight in Ljubljana

DAY 11 LJUBLJANA - BLED - LJUBLJANA

Full day excursion to Bled, the charming lakeside town with its imposing castle perched on a cliff. On a ride in the typical "pletna" boats we will reach the island in the center of the lake where the beautiful Gothic church stands on the foundations of a temple dedicated to the ancient Slavic goddess of love Živa. Free time for lunch and return to Ljubljana.

DAY 12 LJUBLJANA – TRIESTE - VENICE MESTRE

Leaving Ljubljana we head to Trieste, Italy, for an orientation tour and visit the Miramar Castle. The castle was built by the Habsburg monarchy on a cliff overlooking the Adriatic Sea. We continue to the romantic city of Venice. Dinner and overnight in Venice or surroundings.

DAY 13 VENICE MESTRE

Venice is our next destination, a city immortalized in literature, film and art for centuries. Its timeless waterways and artistic masterpieces make it truly unique. Your guide will introduce you to the city on an orientation walk, during which you will see the famous St. Mark's Square, the Grand Canal and the Rialto Bridge. The rest of the afternoon is yours to explore this unforgettable city on your own. Don't miss the opportunity to take a gondola and water cab to explore Venice from the water

DAY 14 VENICE

After breakfast, transfer to the airport at the appointed time.

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DAY 1 BUCHAREST

Arrival in Bucharest and transfer to the hotel. Accommodation.

DAY 2 BUCHAREST – RUSE – VELIKO TARNOVO

Breakfast and panoramic tour of the city during which we will admire the Parliament, the second largest building in the city with more than 1000 rooms and one of the best examples of communist architecture; the Patriarchate, seat of the head of the Orthodox Church: the Romanian Athenaeum, considered a symbol of Romanian culture; the National Museum of Art; the Arc de Triomphe, built in 1935 in the image and likeness of the Parisian Arc, among other monuments. Afterwards, departure to Veliko Tarnovo,

in Bulgaria, with a stop in Ruse for border formalities. Overnight stay.

DAY 3 VELIKO TARNOVO - KAZANLAK - PLOVDIV

Visit of the ancient historical capital of Bulgaria, starting at the Tsarevets fortress, located on the hill of the same name, and seat of the royal and patriarchal palace. The complex consists of 3.6m high walls and three gates, the Royal Palace, the Patriarchate, the Baldwin Tower and the Asenova Gate.

We then return to the centre of Veliko Tarnovo where we will have a short walk to discover the House of the Monkey, the Church of Saints Kirill and Methodil, the Samovodska Charshiya Bazaar and the Sarfkina House, among others.



Afterwards we drive to Kazanlak in the Valley of Roses to visit the Thracian Tomb from the 4th century BC. A unique monument of this period and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, it is part of an important necropolis of the Thracian period, where more than 1000 tombs of kings and aristocratic members of the Thracian society can be found. The tomb consists of a narrow corridor and a round burial chamber, decorated with frescoes depicting various moments of life. Arrival in Plovdiv and overnight.

DAY 4 PLOVDIV - DOBARSKO - RILA - SOFIA

Departure to Dobarsko, where the most interesting frescoes of the country can be found. The frescoes of the Church of Theodore Tyro and Theodore Stratelates, from the beginning of the 17th century, present the main donors (Bogdan, Hasiya and his son) as well as the builders Spas, Stanko and Smilen and Jesus. The 19th century frescoes in the Church of the Purification of the Virgin depict the Bulgarian National Awakening, the period of economic and cultural development of the Bulgarian nation under the rule of the Ottoman Empire.

We continue our journey to the Rila Monastery. Founded in the first half of the 10th century, the Rila Monastery became the main spiritual, educational and cultural centre of the country. Arrival in Sofia and overnight.

DAY 5 SOFIA – BELOGRADCHICK

Breakfast and panoramic city tour including the city walls, churches and ancient streets built during the Byzantine era. Today the center of Sofia is a combination of Western styles such as Neo-Rococo, Neo-Renaissance and

Neoclassicism, including the Church of St. Sophia; the Alexander Nevsky Cathedral, one of the largest Orthodox churches in the world; the Boyana Church; the Ivan Vazov National Theatre, among other monuments.

Then departure to Belogradchick. On arrival, visit of its fortress and the incredible landscape that the rock formations of the area draw. Overnight stav.

DAY 6 BELOGRADCHICK - CRAIOVA - COZIA - SIBIU

Today we say goodbye to Bulgaria and return to Romania. The first stop on the way will be Craiova, whose life revolves around its beautiful Town Hall, the Cathedral of St. Demetrios, the Church of the Monastery of Cosuna and the Baniei House, among others. We continue to Cozia, where we can admire the 14th century Monastery

dedicated to the Holy Trinity. It houses the tomb of Mircea I of Wallachia and is one of the most outstanding monuments of the medieval period, as well as being the only Byzantine-style monastery in Romania still standing. Arrival in Sibiu and accommodation.

DAY 7 SIBIU - SIGHISOARA - BRASOV

After breakfast, visit of what is probably the most beautiful city in the country. Founded in the 12th century by the German Saxons, much of its architecture is of German influence. Its historic center, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, consists of the Lower Town, with long, wide streets and rustic-style architecture with double-storey houses and the oldest church in the city; and the Upper Town, which has grown up around the Big Square and is home to major buildings such as the Bruckenthal Palace, the Jesuit Church and the Council Tower. The Small Square closes the Upper Town with a network of small, narrow alleys, including the Liar's Bridge and the Holy Trinity Cathedral.

Finally there is the Huet Square, whose main attraction is the Evangelical Lutheran Cathedral, Gothic-style buildings and the Staircase Alley, which leads to the Lower Town

Continuation of the tour to Sighisoara, situated in the Transylvanian Carpathian Mountains. Included in the UNESCO World Heritage List, its historic centre has managed to preserve its fortified medieval layout, in which the Citadel, the Clock Tower and the cemetery stand out. Short visit on arrival with free time to enjoy the city on your own and then transfer to Brasov. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 8 BRASOV - BRAN - PELES - SINAIA - BUCHAREST

Breakfast and departure to Bran, where the most famous castle in Romania is located as the setting of the novel "Dracula" by Bram Stoker. The novel is based on the real character of Prince Vlad III, who fought against the Ottoman Empire and was famous for his cruelty in punishing his enemies. Continuation to Peles Castle, built between 1873 and 1917 and former summer residence of the Romanian roval family, and Sinaia, where we will visit the Sinaia Monastery, founded in the 17th century by Prince Mihail Cantacuzino in honor of the monastery of St. Catherine of Mount Sinai (Egypt). Arrival in Bucharest and accommodation.

DAY 9 BUCHAREST Breakfast at the hotel and transfer to the airport.

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DAY 1 TIRANA

Arrival in Tirana and transfer to the hotel. Accommodation.

DAY 2 TIRANA – OHRID

In the morning panoramic visit of the Albanian capital, seeing, among others, Skenderbey Square, the Ethem Bey Mosque and the National Museum which houses archaeological pieces that tell the history of this country. In the afternoon, departure to Ohrid. On arrival we will enjoy the spa town, included in the list of Cultural Heritage of UNESCO and visit the Church of St. Sophia of the 11th century, the most impressive monument of Macedonia. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 3 OHRID - SKOPJE

Breakfast and departure to Skopje, capital of Macedonia. Arrival and city tour including the Kale Fortress, St. Savior's

Church with its icons carved in walnut wood, Stone Bridge and the old Bazaar. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 4 SKOPJE - SOFIA

We continue our tour entering Bulgaria. Arrival in Sofia, its capital, and panoramic visit of the city including the city walls, churches and ancient streets built during the Byzantine era. Currently the center of Sofia is a combination of Western styles such as Neo-Rococo. Neo-Renaissance and Neoclassicism, which include the Church of St. Sofia; the Alexander Nevsky Cathedral, one of the largest Orthodox churches in the world; the Church of Boyana; the Ivan Vazov National Theater, among other monuments. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 5 SOFIA

In the morning, excursion to the Rila and Boyana Monasteries. Founded in



the first half of the 10th century, the Rila Monastery became the main spiritual, educational and cultural center of the country. Then we visit the Boyana Monastery, a Bulgarian Orthodox church of medieval origin located on the outskirts of Sofia and famous for the frescoes that decorate it, which depict the life of St. Nicholas and the portraits of Tsar Constantine I and Tsarina Irina, among others. Return to Sofia and rest of the day at leisure. Overnight in Sofia.

DAY 6 SOFIA - KAZANLAK - VELIKO TARNOVO

Breakfast and departure to Kazanlak, in the Valley of Roses, to visit the Thracian Tomb, from the 4th century BC. Unique monument of this period and UNESCO World Heritage Site, is part of an important necropolis of the Thracian period, where there are more than 1000 tombs of kings and aristocratic members of Thracian society. The tomb consists of a narrow corridor and a round burial chamber, decorated with frescoes depicting various moments of life. Continuation to Veliko Tarnovo, the former Bulgarian roval capital. Arrival and visit of the Tsarevets fortress. located on the hill of the same name, and seat of the royal and patriarchal palace. The complex is composed of 3.6m high walls and three gates, the Royal Palace, the Patriarchate, the Baldwin Tower and the Asenova Gate. Then we return to the center of Veliko Tarnovo where in a short walk we can discover the House of the Monkey, the Church of Saints Kiril and Metodil, the Samovodska Charshiva Bazaar or the Sarfkina House, among others. Overnight in Veliko Tarnovo.

DAY 7 VELIKO TARNOVO - RUSE - BUCHAREST

Breakfast and departure to Romania, stopping in Ruse for border formalities.

Arrival in Bucharest and visit of the openair Village Museum to discover the rural architecture of the traditional houses of the country.

Afterwards, panoramic tour of the city during which we will admire the Parliament, the second largest building in the city with more than 1000 rooms and one of the best examples of communist architecture: the Patriarchate, seat of the head of the Orthodox Church: the Romanian Athenaeum, considered a symbol of Romanian culture; the National Museum of Art; the Arc de Triomphe, built in 1935 in the image and likeness of the Parisian Arc, among other monuments. Lodging.

DAY 8 BUCHAREST Free day at leisure.

DAY 9 BUCHAREST - SINAIA - PELES - BRAN - BRASOV

Breakfast and departure to Sinaia, where we will visit the Sinaia Monastery, founded in the 17th century by Prince Mihail Cantacuzino in honor of the monastery of St. Catherine of Mount Sinai (Eqvpt): and Peles Castle, built between 1873 and 1917 and former summer residence of the Romanian royal family

Continuation to Bran, where is located the most famous castle in Romania for being the setting of the novel "Dracula" by Bram Stoker. The novel is based on the real character of Prince Vlad III, who fought against the Ottoman Empire and was famous for his cruelty in punishing his enemies. Arrival in Brasov and accommodation.

DAY 10 BRASOV - SIGHISOARA - SIBIU

Continuation of the tour to Sighisoara, located in the Transylvanian Carpathian Mountains. Included in the UNESCO

World Heritage List, its historic center has managed to preserve its fortified medieval layout, in which the Citadel, the Clock Tower and the cemetery stand out. Short visit on arrival with free time to enjoy the city on your own and then transfer to Sibiu.

Upon arrival, visit of what is probably the most beautiful city in the country. Founded in the 12th century by the German Saxons, much of its architecture is of German influence. Its historic center. included in the UNESCO World Heritage List, consists of the Lower Town, with long, wide streets and rustic-style architecture with double-storey houses and the oldest church in the city; and the Upper Town, grown around the Big Square where main buildings such as the Bruckenthal Palace, the Jesuit Church and the Council Tower are located. The Small Square closes the Upper Town with a network of narrow and small alleys, among which stand out the Liar's Bridge and the Holy Trinity Cathedral. Finally there is the Huet Square, whose main attraction is the Evangelical Lutheran Cathedral, Gothic style buildings and the Allev of Stairs, which leads to the Lower Town. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 11 SIBIU - TIMISOARA

Departure in the morning to Timisoara, a multicultural city with the presence of German, Hungarian, Serbian, Italian, Jewish and Greek minorities. The historic center recalls its past as part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire with yellow buildings like the Schönbrunn Palace in Vienna. The center is spread across several squares, with Victoriei, Unirii and Libertatii squares being the most prominent. Here you will find the main symbols of the city such as the old Town Hall from the 18th century; the Catholic Cathedral and the Serbo-Orthodox

Cathedral; the National Theater and the Opera House and numerous civil palaces. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 12 TIMISOARA - NOVI SAD - BELGRADE

We arrive in Serbia entering through Novi Sad, which means "new town". Founded in the middle Ages, it is now a university town, which gives it life and a young population.

Highlights include the Petrovaradin Fortress, the Town Hall, the Church of St. Mary and the Liberty Bridge. Continuation to Belgrade, capital of Serbia.

Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 13 BELGRADE

In the morning we will visit Belgrade, capital of Serbia, a bohemian city with a life almost 24 hours a day, where we can enjoy its stores, restaurants and party places. We will visit the historical center where we will find the Royal Palace, the Parliament, the Republic Square, the Orthodox Church, the National Theater and the Kalemegdan Fortress, as well as the confluence of the Danube and Sava rivers. Free afternoon. Overnight at the hotel.

DAY 14 BELGRADE

Breakfast at the hotel and at the agreed time, transfer to the airport..

Afterwards we will continue with a pleasant walking tour through the center that will take us to St. Stephen's Cathedral, the narrow streets of the

Jewish guarter, the house where Mozart lived or the Danube Canal, an area of street artists.

We will finish the visit with one of the most Viennese customs: enjoying a cup of coffee and the famous Sacher cake. Afternoon at leisure and overnight in Vienna

DAY 3 VIENNA – LJUBLJANA

We start our trip to Ljubljana, capital of Slovenia. Upon arrival we will enjoy a panoramic tour of the capital, during which we will see the old town, the Town Hall, the Robba Fountain, the Three Bridges, the University and the Cultural



Center. Afternoon at leisure and overnight at the hotel

DAY 4 LJUBLJANA - BLED - POSTOJNA - LJUBLJANA

Today we go on excursion to the city of Bled and Postoina caves. Located north of Ljubljana, Bled is known for the alpine lake and its island in the center, where we will visit the Church of the Assumption of the Virgin.

To reach the island we will enjoy a boat ride on the "Pletna", their typical boats. Upon arrival, we will climb the 99 steps to admire the church and its bell, whose legend says that if you make a wish while ringing the bell, it will be fulfilled. Then we will head to visit the Postojna caves, where we will make a tour aboard a little train to reach the center of the cave where we can appreciate its ghostly formations of stalactites and stalagmites that show us a beautiful spectacle. Return to Ljubljana and accommodation.

DAY 5 LJUBLJANA - ZAGREB

After breakfast we departure to Zagreb, Croatia. We will have a city tour upon our arrival through the largest city in the country and capital of the Republic of Croatia. It grew from 2 twin cities, Gradec (which was fortified against Tatar attacks in the 13th century and some of its medieval walls and porticoes still exist. It has several beautiful churches, gothic and baroque palaces) and Kaptol (where the capitals of the cathedral, decorated with complicated filigree, and the bishop's palace stand out).

The pastel-painted buildings of Gradec and Kaptol contrast with the gray stone of the radial city center of Zagreb. Afternoon at leisure.

DAY 6 ZAGREB - KRK - RIJEKA

After breakfast, we will depart to the Croatian coast, where we will have the opportunity to discover one of the most spectacular natural parks in the country, the Krk National Park, which stretches along the Krka River, forming up to 7 natural waterfalls and one of the best preserved natural ecosystems in Europe. In the afternoon arrival to the town of Rijeka, in the bay of Carnaro and one of the main ports of the Austro-Hungarian Empire until 1918. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 7 RIJEKA - PLITVICE - ZADAR

We head inland to visit the Plitvice National Park. one of the most beautiful natural creations in the world, which has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We will be able to admire the quiet beauty of lakes and waterfalls that will show us an unforgettable spectacle. In the afternoon departure to Zadar. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 8 ZADAR - SIBENIK - TROGIR - SPLIT

Breakfast buffet and departure to Sibenik to visit the Cathedral of St. James, and Trogir, the best preserved Romanesque-Gothic complex in the Adriatic area and Central Europe. The medieval center includes the walls of the time, the castle with watchtower and several palaces of Romanesque, Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque styles. Continuation of the trip to Split. Arrival and panoramic tour of the city, which will be done on foot through the old center, which stands out for its charm and the famous Diocletian's Palace.

DAY 9 SPLIT - SARAJEVO

We continue our tour to Sarajevo, capital of

Bosnia and Herzegovina. Known for the religious diversity that has coexisted here for centuries (Catholics, Orthodox, Jews and Muslims all have their place in the city), Sarajevo has attracted international attention several times in its history. From being the scene of the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand of Austria. which led to the outbreak of World War I, to hosting the Winter Olympics in 1984, to being today a city recovered and adapted to the post-war reality of the 1990s.

Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 10 SARAJEVO

Today we will visit the amazing capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina. Renovated after the Balkan War, the historic center once again offers the oriental-Ottoman charm of yesteryear. During the panoramic tour we will see Theater, the Academy of Arts, the

> monuments. During the tour we invite you to visit the Tunnel of Life, built during the Balkan War and which served to save thousands of lives. Afternoon free at Leisure and accommodation.

DAY 11 SARAJEVO – MEDJUGORJE - MOSTAR - DUBROVNIK

We return to Croatia visiting on the way the town of Medjugorje, an important Marian center of pilgrimages since 1981 when the image of the Virgin Mary appeared on its hill with her message of peace to those present there; and Mostar, a city that during the Ottoman Empire was a commercial center and that today we can discover visible traces

the Bascarsija Bazaar, the Ali Pascha and Gazi-Husrev-Beg mosques, the National Roman-Catholic Cathedral, among other

of this empire visiting the old bazaar, the mosque and its famous stone bridge, rebuilt with the collaboration of the military of the Spanish forces under NATO mandate.

Arrival in Dubrovnik and overnight.

DAY 12 DUBROVNIK

After breakfast we will take a panoramic walking tour of the old city, protected by the 16th century Revelin fortress located to the east, which is only for pedestrians. Its double walls of 20 towers and bastions surround the baroque cathedral and exquisite churches, monasteries, palaces, fountains and houses with red or vellow roofs.

Dubrovnik acquired fabulous wealth from trade during the Middle Ages and was famous for its art from the 15th to 17th century.

The old city of Dubrovnik has, among its many attractions, the following monuments that we will visit: the Onofrio Fountain, the Franciscan and Dominican Monasteries, the Sponza and Rector's Palaces, and the Cathedral. Free afternoon and overnight.

DAY 13 DUBROVNIK

Breakfast and at the agreed time, transfer to the airport.

Then we move to the city of Shkoder. Upon arrival, we will visit the city including the Rozafa fortress, while on a walk through the city we will see the Catholic cathedral and the lead mosque. We continue the journey to Montenegro, where we will visit the city of Kotor including the Cathedral of St. Tryphon, the fortress of St. Ivan, the city gates and the Pima and Drago Palaces. Continue to Budva for dinner and overnight.

DAY 3 BUDVA - DUBROVNIK - MOSTAR After breakfast we depart to Dubrovnik. where we will visit the old city. On a walk through the center we will see the



Pila Gate, the Great Onofrio Fountain. the Rector's Palace, the Franciscan monastery and the Stradun Promenade. In the afternoon we will drive to the city of Mostar. During the guided tour we will see the old bridge, the Tara and Halebija towers, the Turkish bath (hammam), the clock tower, the Metropolitan Palace, the Karadjoz-Beg Mosque and the old market. Dinner and overnight in Mostar.

DAY 4 MOSTAR - SARAJEVO

We continue our tour to Saraievo. Upon arrival we will enjoy a full day tour, during which we will see the town hall, the old Bazaar, the old locksmiths market, the Orthodox Church, the Roman cathedral, the Latin bridge and the war tunnel museum. Dinner and overnight in Sarajevo.

DAY 5 SARAJEVO - OSTROG - SHKODER

Today we leave for Montenegro, passing the border in Hum and enjoying the panoramic views from the mountain road. In the afternoon we visit Podgorica to see the Millennium Bridge, St. George's Church and the old town. Continue to Shkoder in Albania, crossing the border at Han i Hotit. Dinner and overnight.

DAY 6 SHKODER - LAKE KOMAN - PRIZREN

DAY 7 PRIZREN - SKOPJE

Breakfast at the hotel and then departure to Skopje, capital of North Macedonia. On arrival we will visit the city including the old Bazaar area, the Kale Fortress, the church of St. Spa, the Daut pasha Haman, the Stone Bridge, the railroad station and the memorial house of Mother Teresa.

Dinner and overnight.

DAY 8 SKOPJE - OHRID

In the morning we will drive to Ohrid, on the shore of the lake of the same name. In the afternoon we will enjoy a walk

through the old town, declared world cultural heritage by UNESCO, highlighting the ancient theater, the fortifications of the old city, the Church of St. Clement, the archaeological ruins of Plaoshnik, the Cathedral of St. Sophia and the main promenade full of stores, bars and gourmet places. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 9 OHRID - TIRANA

We continue to Albania. We will discover its capital, Tirana, with a panoramic visit around the Skanderberg Square, the Et Hem bey Mosque, the Palace of Culture, the Martyrs of the Nation Boulevard and Mother Teresa Square. Rest of the day at leisure. Dinner and overnight in Tirana.



DAY 10 TIRANA

Free morning to enjoy Tirana, go shopping or visit the National Museum. At the indicated time, transfer to the airport.

DAY 4 IOANNINA - KALAMBAKA

Visit of Ioannina, a city built on the shores of Lake Pamviotis. Then departure to Kalambaka and visit of Meteora, known for its monasteries and churches built on rock formations on the top of the hills. Dinner and overnight in Kalambaka.

DAY 5 KALAMBAKA - HERAKLEA - BITOLA - OHRID

In the morning we continue to enjoy our journey through northern Greece, crossing the border with Macedonia to the town of Heraklea. Visit of the archaeological park, known for the ruins of the Roman theater and baths, the Jewish temple, the Episcopal Church, the baptistery and the ancient city portico. Continuation to Ohrid, with a stop in Bitola. Dinner and overnight in Ohrid.

DAY 6 OHRID - SAN NAUM - OHRID

Visit of Ohrid, a UNESCO heritage site, including the ancient theater, the ancient fortifications of the city, the church of St. Clement, the archaeological ruins of Plaoshnik and the cathedral of St. Sophia. Free time to enjoy a stroll along the main avenue lined with stores, bars and restaurants.

DAY 7 OHRID - TIRANA

After breakfast we continue our journey back to Albania. Upon arrival we will enjoy a panoramic tour of Tirana, passing

by Skanderberg Square, Et Hem bey Mosque, Palace of Culture, Martyrs of the Nation Boulevard and Mother Teresa Square. Rest of the day at leisure. Dinner and overnight in Tirana.

DAY 8 TIRANA

Free morning to explore Tirana, go shopping or visit the National Museum. At the indicated time, transfer to the airport.

We continue the circuit to Budva, considered one of the oldest cities in the Adriatic area, where we will make a walk through the old town and admire its Venetian style architecture, in which the churches of St. Ivan, St. Mary and the Holy Trinity stand out. Overnight in Budva.

DAY 3 BUDVA - SHKODER

Departure to Shkoder, formerly known as Scutari and third largest city in Albania.



Visit of the city known for its handicraft and communications center, especially for the river traffic that favored trade. Then visit the Rozafa Castle, built on a rocky hill where you can see beautiful and attractive views. Overnight in Shkoder.

DAY 4 SHKODER - KOMAN - VALBONA

Departure to the Koman dam. On board the ferry we will enjoy a 3-hour ride on the Koman Lake. In the afternoon we will visit the Valbona National Park amidst the breathtaking panoramic views of the Drini river valley, with canyons, waterfalls and incredible rock formations. Overnight in Valbona.

DAY 5 VALBONA - DECANI - PEJE - KOLASIN

We continue the tour to Decani through Qafe Morina bordering Kosovo. Visit of the Decani Monastery, situated in a picturesque valley of the Bistrica River, surrounded by mountains and forests. Continuation to Kolasin, in Montenegro. Overnight in Kolasin.

We continue to the Ostrog Monastery, a real architectural marvel carved into the rock. Since ancient times the mountain caves were the homes of hermits, who used them for seclusion and prayer. In the afternoon, departure to Sarajevo. The trip will take us through the mountains of Bosnia and the Pluzine Valley in Montenegro, passing through Niksic, known for its popular local beer. Overnight in Sarajevo.

DAY 7 SARAJEVO

The city's main tourist attractions include: the Old Town, home to the city's most important religious sites, such as the Old Orthodox Church of Sarajevo, the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart and the Gazi Husrev-beg Mosque, the world's first mosque with electricity. Then we will visit the Tunnel of Life. Afternoon at leisure and overnight in Sarajevo.

DAY 8 SARAJEVO - MOSTAR - SPLIT

Departure to Mostar. Upon arrival we will visit the city touring the bishopric, the Christian basilica of Cim, the Turkish baths (Hammam), the clock tower, the synagogue and the Jewish memorial cemetery, the Metropolitan Palace, the Karadjoz-Beg Mosque, the Orthodox Church, the Catholic Church and the Franciscan Monastery, the residence of Ottoman, the stone bridge (symbol of the city) and the Tara and Halebija Towers. We continue to Split, in Croatia. Overnight in Split.

DAY 9 SPLIT - PLITVICE NATIONAL PARK

After breakfast, tour of the city of Split, during which we explore the Diocletian's Palace, declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, with its peristyle, the Temple of Jupiter and the Cathedral. Other highlights include the bell tower of St. Domnius, the statue of Gregory the Nin, the Golden Gate, the town clock and the town hall. Then, departure to Plitvice. Overnight in Plitvice.

DAY 10 PLITVICE NATIONAL PARK - ZAGREB

In the morning we visit the Plitvice Lakes. Embraced by high forested mountains, sixteen beautiful lakes of

blue-green and crystal clear water are intertwined. Transfer to Zagreb. Upon arrival, panoramic visit of the capital of Croatia, which has grown from the two medieval settlements, Kaptol and Gradec, which for centuries developed on the neighboring hills. Overnight in Zagreb.

DAY 11 ZAGREB Breakfast at the hotel and at the indicated hour, transfer to the airport of Zagreb.

Departure to Gamzigrad-Romuliana, part of the UNESCO heritage site, which includes a late Roman palace and memorial complex built in the late 3rd and early 4th century, commissioned by Emperor Galerius Maximilianus. We

DAY 4 NIS - NOVI PAZAR - KOLASIN

Transfer to Novi Pazar, the most prominent Ottoman city in Serbia and home to some of the oldest Serbian Orthodox churches and monasteries, such as the Sopocani Monastery, a World Heritage Site. Transfer to Kolasin and overnight.

DAY 5 KOLASIN - MORACA - BUDVA

Today we start the day with a visit to the Orthodox monastery of monks, the Moraca Monastery, built in 1252. This mystical sacred building is surrounded, like a medieval fortress, with a high stone wall inside, whose interior rooms can tell some legends of this area. We continue to Budva and visit the old town on arrival. Overnight stay.

DAY 6 BUDVA

Free day in Budva for optional tours. Overnight in Budva.

DAY 7 BUDVA - KOTOR - DUBROVNIK

In the morning, the guide will take us through the entrance gate of the ancient city of Kotor to visit the medieval tower on the main square, decorated with a stone pyramid. DAY 1 SKOPJE

Arrival at Skopje airport, meeting with our guide and transfer to the hotel. Panoramic tour of the city of Skopje, located in the heart of the Balkan Peninsula, being an important crossroads of communications for 2,000 years. During the visit we will see the Kale Fortress, the Church of St. Savior with its icons carved in walnut wood, the Stone Bridge and the old Bazaar. Overnight.

DAY 2 SKOPJE - TETOVO - SKOPJE

Today we will go on an excursion to Tetovo, in the north of the country and close to the border with Kosovo. We will visit the painted Mosque Sarena Dzamija, from 1438, in whose current courtyard of Dzamija are the fountain for ritual cleansing (Wudu) and the octagonal tomb of the founders Hurshide and Mensure. Next we visited the Arabati Baba Tekke, established in 1538 by Ali Baba, brotherin-law of Suleiman the Magnificent.



Here he spent the rest of his years as a Bektashi dervish dedicated to Sufism, a mystical branch of Islam. In the afternoon we return to Skopje.

DAY 3 SKOPJE - BITOLA - OHRID

Departure to Ohrid. Our first stop will be in Bitola. Known as "Manastir" under Ottoman occupation, from this period are the most outstanding monuments, such as the Jahdar-Kadi mosque, by the famous Ottoman architect Sinan, the catholic co-cathedral of the Sacred Heart. the Clock Tower - its symbol - and the Sirok Sokak avenue, the main commercial center of the city. We continue the tour to Ohrid, on the shores of the lake with the same name. Overnight stay.

DAY 4 OHRID

In the morning we will make the panoramic visit of Ohrid, which will discover the city known as the 2nd Jerusalem. Famous for having had 365 churches, only 70 have survived to the present day. Listed as a UNESCO heritage site for its unique heritage values, Ohrid was the oldest and most complete architectural ensemble in southeastern Europe. Free afternoon to enjoy the Ohrid Lake. Overnight stay.

DAY 5 OHRID - TIRANA

Departure to Tirana. Arrival and panoramic visit. We explore the capital of Albania, which includes some of the most important historical points, such as the Skanderberg Statue, the Et Hembey Mosque, the Clock Tower, the Palace of Culture, the Martyrs of the Nation Boulevard and Mother Teresa Square. as well as examples of communist

architecture, in this case painted with cheerful colors. Rest of the day at leisure and overnight.

DAY 6 TIRANA - KRUJA - TIRANA

Today we will enjoy an excursion to Kruja. On a walking tour following the cobblestone path of the Ottoman bazaar, we will discover its wooden stores with the exhibition of various gifts and antique household items. The visit inside the castle walls will include the historical museum dedicated to Skanderberg and its resistance against the Ottoman invasion. Free time to finish discovering the city and return to Tirana. Overnight in Tirana.

DAY 7 TIRANA - SHKODER - BUDVA

After breakfast we continue our tour to Shkoder. It is the largest city in northern Albania, located east of Lake Shkoder, between the rivers Drini and Buna. Free time to discover the pedestrian street Kol Idromeno and visit the castle of Rozafa, built on a rocky hill where you can see beautiful and attractive views. We continue the circuit to Budva, considered one of the oldest cities in the Adriatic area, where we will take a walk through the old town and admire its Venetian style architecture, in which the churches of St. Ivan, St. Mary and the Holy Trinity stand out. Overnight in Budva.

DAY 8 BUDVA - DUBROVNIK

We depart for Skopje in Macedonia, stopping on the way to visit the Gracanica Monastery, one of the last monumental estates of King Milutin. Gracanica was built on the ruins of the oldest church of the 13th century, belonging to Theotokos, and the ruins of a Christian basilica of the early 6th century. Arrival in Skopje, dinner and overnight.



DAY 4 SKOPJE - MAVROVO NATIONAL PARK - OHRID

Beginning of the panoramic tour of the city of Skopje, whose traces of the East and the Ottoman Empire are still present. In the old town we visit the Daud Pasha baths, once the largest baths in the Balkans and now the city's Art Gallery, the imposing Mustafa Pasha Mosque or the bustling old market area. Free time in the old hazaar

We continue to Mavrovo National Park, located in the central-western part of the country, which offers the highest mountain peaks in Macedonia. In Mavrovo National Park is the famous village of Galichnik and the Monastery of Sveti Jovan Bigorski (St. John the Baptist).

Continue to Ohrid for dinner and overnight.

DAY 5 OHRID - SAN NAUM - OHRID

After breakfast, walking tour of the old town of Ohrid (UNESCO heritage), a luminous city with a rich cultural and historical heritage in which many civilizations left their own mark. Welcome to the magical place where cultural and natural heritage blend surprisingly well with its hospitality. The highlight of Ohrid sightseeing includes the Churches of St. Sophia, St. Bogorodica Perivlepta and St. Pantelejmon - Plaosnik, the Old Bazaar, King Samoil's Fortress, the Old Theater, etc. In the afternoon visit to the Medieval Monastic Complex of St. Naum.

DAY 6 OHRID - BERAT

Today we will drive to Berat to visit one of the most important sites in Albania, which is listed as a UNESCO Heritage Site. On the walking tour we will explore the ancient fortress, the main gates,

the towers, the orthodox churches, the typical architecture of the local 2500 year old houses and the Onufri Museum, located inside the church of St. Mary. Possibility of an optional tour with wine tasting at the Cobo Winery. Dinner and overnight in Berat.

DAY 7 BERAT - TIRANA

After breakfast, we will depart for Tirana, the capital of Albania, whose history is enriched by the coexistence of such rich cultural societies as the Christian and Islamic worlds in Europe. During the city tour you will see the impact of these influences on its architecture. The tour will highlight some symbols and remnants of the communist era to provide you with a general understanding of Albanian history. Visit the National Historical Museum and the Et'hem Bey Mosque. Dinner and overnight in Tirana.

DAY 8 TIRANA - KRUJA - AIRPORT

Today, before transferring to the airport, we will drive to Kruja. Upon arrival, we will start touring the medieval fortress of the city on Kruja hill. The walking tour will take us through the cobblestone path of the Ottoman bazaar, with wooden stores and displays of various antique gifts and household items. The visit within the castle walls will include the historical museum dedicated to Skanderbeg and his resistance against the Ottoman invasion. An old house converted into an ethnographic museum will invite us to see a unique cultural aspect of life in northern Albania.

DAY 1 VIENNA

Arrival in Vienna and transfer to the hotel. In the evening, we will enjoy a ride on the famous giant Ferris wheel, located in the Prater amusement park, and a welcome dinner in one of the typical wine taverns in the districts of Neusitft am Walde, Nußdorf or Grinzing. Return to the hotel and overnight.

DAY 2 VIENNA

Always associated with the imperial palaces and Sisi, Vienna is also the birthplace of the "Secession", one of the most important artistic movements of the turn of the 19th – 20th centuries, which laid the foundations of Austrian modernism. Among its members are Gustav Klimt, Egon Schiele and Oskar Kokoschka. On our citv tour we will visit the Belvedere Palace, now the National Art Gallery. Among its treasures you can see the masterpiece of Viennese Art Nouveau, the painting "The Kiss"

by Gustav Klimt. Then we will go to the Secession building, where we will admire another of the key works of Austrian art, "The Beethoven Frieze", in which Klimt also put images to the 9th Symphony of the composer Ludwig von Beethoven. On the way we will see other modernist works such as the Pavilion and the Otto Wagner Houses, as well as the most outstanding buildings of the city, such as the Opera House, the Hofburg or Winter Palace, the Museum of Fine Arts and its twin Museum of Natural History, the Parliament, the Town Hall or the Votive Church, among others.

We will end the visit tasting one of the most Viennese customs: a cup of coffee accompanied by the famous Sacher cake

In the afternoon we will enjoy a private visit to the Leopold Museum, the jewel of the renovated museum district, which houses the largest private collection of works by Egon Shiele and Oskar



Kokoschka, among other artists of Austrian modernism. Free evening.

DAY 3 VIENNA

In the morning we will visit the Ephesos Museum, established at the end of the 19th century to house the archaeological remains found in the city of Ephesos in present-day Turkey. Among its treasures are "The Amazons of the Altar of Artemis". the "Monument to the Partisans" and the bronze statue of an athlete. This visit will connect us with the second part of the trip in Turkey. Afternoon at leisure to finish enjoying Vienna.

DAY 4 VIENNA - ISTANBUL

Breakfast at the hotel and at the appointed time, transfer to the airport to board the flight to Istanbul. Arrival and transfer to the hotel.

DAY 5 ISTANBUL

Full day tour of the city that acts as a bridge between East and West. Among its jewels we will visit the Hagia Sophia Cathedral, a masterpiece of Byzantine art and converted into a mosque again in August 2020; the Sultan Ahmed Mosque, noted for its 6 minarets and better known as the "blue mosque" for the decoration in blue, white and green tiles; the Topkapi and Dolmabahce Palaces; the subway cistern; the Galatea Bridge and Taksim Square. Stop for lunch (included) during the visit. Free evening.

DAY 6 ISTANBUL

Free day to enjoy Istanbul in its splendor. We recommend visiting the Grand Bazaar and the Spice Bazaar, or embark on a boat trip on the Bosphorus.

DAY 7 ISTANBUL - PERGAMON - IZMIR

After breakfast departure to Pergamon, the main cultural center of the Hellenic period.

We will visit the archaeological park where the famous Pergamon Altar, which can be visited in Berlin, was found. It highlights the acropolis, with ruins of what were the library, the theater, several palaces and the place where the Altar of Zeus was erected. Leaving Pergamon we will also see the ruins of the Asclepion, a building dedicated to the god of medicine and that would become a renowned medical school Continuation to Izmir

Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 8 EXCURSION TO EPHESUS

Today we will go on an excursion to Ephesus, one of the main cities of Ancient Greece and home to one of the 7 wonders of the ancient world, the Temple of Artemis.

Occupied over the centuries by the Hellenic, Roman and Byzantine cultures, it has reached our days with a cultural treasure difficult to surpass. We will visit the ruins of these civilizations. including the Library of Celsus, the Great Theater, the Odeon, the agora, the Roman basilica, several baths and public latrines, temples dedicated to Domitian, Hadrian and Serapis, the Trajan fountain and the pritaneum, seat of the magistrates.

On the outskirts of Ephesus we will also visit the Basilica of St. John, where St. John supposedly wrote his gospel; and the House of the Virgin Mary, where according to tradition she arrived after the crucifixion and lived until her ascension. Return to Izmir and overnight.

DAY 9 IZMIR - DUBAI Breakfast at the hotel and at the appointed time, transfer to the airport to board the flight to Dubai, with a stopover in Istanbul. Arrival in Dubai and overnight.

DAY 10 DUBAI

Departure to discover the capital of one of the 7 emirates that make up the United Arab Emirates. Founded in the second half of the 18th century, Dubai was a fishing town until it became the international metropolis it is today. During the guided tour we will see this contrast between the traditional part, with the Jumeirah Mosque of 1979, the palace of Sheikh Sheikh Mohammed and the Al-Fahidi fort: and the modern part in which stands out above all the Buri Khalifa Tower, inaugurated in 2010 as the tallest building in the world with more than 800m. The architecture is the most visible art of Dubai; to the examples already mentioned we can add the Palm Jumeirah Island, an artificial archipelago created in front of the coast where there are private residences and some of the most luxurious and well-known hotels; the Opera House; the Dubai Creek, where the spice market is located, and the Madinat Theater. Afternoon at leisure to tour some of the famous shopping malls, relax on the beaches and admire the spectacle of light and color in the Palm Fountains, the largest in the world, with 1,335m², jets up to 105m high and illuminated by 3,000 LED bulbs.

DAY 11 DUBAI - Excursion to Abu Dhahi

Today we will go on an excursion to Abu Dhabi, the capital of the United Arab Emirates, Like Dubai, Abu Dhabi

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has experienced rapid growth since the 1980s, resulting in imposing modern architecture, with skyscrapers such as the Capital Plaza or the Scheich-Zayid Mosque, contrasting with traditional buildings such as the Qasr al-Husn fort and palatial residences.

Upon arrival we will take a guided tour to see the skyline on the coast and its main attractions.

We will also visit the Louvre Abu Dhabi Museum, opened in 2017 as a franchise of the famous Parisian museum. With this facility, the city positions itself as the cultural destination of the Emirates. Its collection spans art from Antiquity to the 21st century, with works by Picasso, Magritte and Gauguin among them, on loan from major Parisian museums (Louvre, Orsav and George Pompidou), Free time for lunch and individual walks. In the afternoon, return to Dubai. Overnight in Dubai.

DAY 12 DUBAI

Breakfast at the hotel and at the appointed time, transfer to the Airport.

After breakfast we will depart to Hungary. Upon arrival in Budapest we will discover the city divided by the Danube River. On the one hand, the city of Buda located on top of the hill, in whose old town are the castle and the Fishermen's Bastion, from which you can admire the panoramic view.

Then we descend from the hill to discover the Pest side, the new town, passing by the Andrassy Boulevard, the Opera House, St. Stephen's Basilica, the Great Synagogue and the Heroes' Square. We finish the visit at the Great Market, where we can have a taste of typical specialties of the country.

In the evening, we will enjoy a boat ride on the river while admiring the illuminations of the city.

DAY 5 BUDAPEST

Today we will discover some of the most beautiful spots along the Danube River on this full day excursion to its bend, which hides the jewels of St. Andreas, a village of craftsmen; Visegrad, the former capital and royal residence; and Esztergom, a Catholic center with its imposing cathedral.

DAY 6 BUDAPEST

Free day to enjoy personal activities, visit a spa or take a gastronomic tour of the Central Market and Ruin Pubs.

DAY 7 BUDAPEST - BRATISLAVA - PRAGUE

We continue our journey to Bratislava,

capital of Slovakia and located on the banks of the Danube River. After a brief stop at the castle to enjoy the view, free time to discover the small but interesting historical center of the city. Afterwards we will get on our tour to Praque. Arrival and accommodation.

DAY 8 PRAGUE The visit of the city begins in the castle district, located up on a hill. Its main highlights are St. Vitus Cathedral, the Royal Palace, St. George's Chapel and the Golden Street.

Going down we will reach the Mala Strana district (small town in its translation), which stands out for the narrow streets and typical buildings of the area. DAY 2 INNSBRUCK - LAKE ACHENSEE - TYROLAN VILLAGES - INNSBRUCK

In the morning we leave for the town of Jenbach, where we will visit the Tratzberg Castle, a curious jewel of the Renaissance in the Alps, which is not very usual in this part of Austria. Then we will take the steam rack railway, one of the oldest still in operation in the country, to go up to Lake Achensee (May to October), the highest alpine lake in the Tyrol. A boat ride around the lake will allow us to admire the spectacular views of the mountains.

We continue the tour through the Tyrolean villages where we can discover real treasures. Our first stop will be Rattenberg, known as the "city of glass" for the presence of several workshops that work the glass in a handmade way

and where we will have free time to stroll through its medieval old town. We continue to Schwaz, where architectural wonders await us as the central nave of the parish church of the Ascension of St. Mary, from the 15th century and the largest in the Tyrolean region. We continue to Hall in Tirol, whose medieval historic center is the best preserved in the region. Highlights include the Town Hall and the church of St. Nikolaus. Gothic style. Return to Innsbruck and overnight.

DAY 3 INNSBRUCK - KITZSTEINHORN - ZELL AM SEE

In the morning, we will take a guided walk through the historic center. The Middle Ages merge into the 21st century through charming alleys, the Maria-Theresia promenade crowned by its Triumphal Arch and the Golden Roof, the Imperial Church and Palace. We will continue our tour to the Bergisel, the Olympic diving platform where the best views of the city and the surrounding mountains await us. We will then drive to the Kitzsteinhorn



Mountain, the roof of Salzburg. We will climb to the viewpoint located at over 3.000m, we will learn about the creation of glacial ice, watch an informative video about the fauna and flora of the area and enjoy the Ice Arena (Ice Arena only open in July and August).

Transfer to Zell am See, one of the main ski centers and mountain activities in Austria. Overnight stay.

DAY 4 ZELL AM SEE - WERFEN - SALZBURG

After breakfast we will take a walk through the center to see its main treasures, such as the 12th century Kastnerturm Tower, the parish church and the 14th century Rosenberg Castle, which today houses the town hall and an art gallerv.

We will continue our tour to Salzburg, not without first admiring one of the most spectacular natural creations, the Werfen Ice Cave (May to October), on our way to Zell am See. After a cable car ride we will take a walking tour inside the cave, crossing about 134meters of altitude while admiring the beauty of the ice sculptures and the impressive dimensions of the cave.

Arrival in Salzburg and overnight.

DAY 5 SALZBURG - LAKES and MOUNTAINS

Breakfast buffet at the hotel and departure to discover the birthplace of Mozart, passing by the Mirabell Palace, the Mozarteum (University of Music), the Marionette Theater, Mozart's residence, the Church of the Holy Trinity, Hellbrunn Palace, Nonnberg Abbey, the Music Festival Theaters, Getreidegasse and Mozart Square.

Then departure to the region known

under the name of "Salzkammergut" (the chamber of salt goods, in translation). Area created under the Habsburg Empire to protect the salt mines and their economic benefits, covers the territory of 3 regions - Salzburg, Upper Austria and Styria - which highlights a spectacular landscape of lakes and mountains. We will visit St Gilgen, birthplace of Mozart's mother; we will take a boat trip on the lake and disembark in St Wolfgang (May to October), where we will enjoy a walking tour of this village worthy of fairy tales. Free time for lunch and continue our excursion to Hallstatt, a picturesque village located between the lake and the mountains that offers spectacular views

to visitors. It is considered the most beautiful village

in Austria.

Overnight in the area of the lakes and mountains.

DAY 6 LAKES AND MOUNTAINS - DANUBE VALLEY - VIENNA

Today we leave for Melk, where stands the imposing Abbey, the best and greatest example of Austrian Baroque architecture and from which we can admire a unique view over the Danube. Free time for lunch and then we will take a boat trip (May to October) to Dürnstein, a beautiful medieval town crowned by the blue bell tower of the Augustinian church. Free time to stroll around Dürnstein. We continue to Vienna. Overnight stay.

DAY 7 VIENNA

In the morning we will go for a sightseeing tour in Vienna. Driving around the Ringstrasse we will see the most outstanding buildings of the city, such as the Opera House, the Hofburg or Winter Palace, the Museum of Fine Arts and

its twin Museum of Natural History, the Parliament, the City Hall or the Votive Church, among others. We will continue with a pleasant walking tour through the center that will take us to St. Stephen's Cathedral, the narrow streets of the Jewish guarter, the house where Mozart lived or the Danube Canal. an area of street artists. We will finish the visit with one of the most Viennese customs: having a coffee with a Sacher cake at one of popular coffee houses.

Afternoon at leisure and overnight in Vienna.

DAY 8 VIENNA – DUBAI Breakfast at the hotel and at the appointed time, transfer to the airport to board the plane to Dubai.

DAY 9 DUBAI

Morning arrival in Dubai and transfer to the hotel. Free time at leisure. In the afternoon, panoramic tour to discover the capital of one of the 7 emirates that make up the United Arab Emirates. Founded in the second half of the 18th century, Dubai was a fishing city until it became the international metropolis of today. During the guided tour we will see this contrast between the traditional part. with the Jumeirah Mosque of 1979, the palace of Sheikh Sheikh Mohammed and the Al-Fahidi Fort: and the modern part in which stands out above all the Burj Khalifa Tower, inaugurated in 2010 as the tallest building in the world with more than 800m.

DAY 10 DUBAI - Desert experience. Morning at leisure to enjoy the beach, traditional markets or relax in a spa.



In the afternoon we will head out into the desert for a 4x4 safari.

During the safari we will be able to see the fascinating landscape of dunes, its flora and fauna. Hopefully we will see gazelles and other native animals, such as the Arabian oryx. Then, on the back of a camel caravan, we will arrive at a Bedouin camp, where we can learn about their traditions and enjoy an authentic Bedouin dinner.

Today we will stay in a glamping resort in the desert. In the morning, you can choose to relax by the resort's pool or watch the sunrise on a hot air balloon ride.

DAY 11 DUBAI

Breakfast at the resort and at the indicated time, transfer to the airport.

DAY 1 EREVAN

DAY 2 EREVAN – ECHMIADZIN - ZVARTNOC - EREVAN

Breakfast and panoramic tour of Yerevan, whose main tourist attractions are the Republic Square, Mashtots Avenue, the Opera House, Swam Lake and the Cascade Monument. We visit the Tsitsernakaberd Memorial and the Museum of the victims of the Armenian Genocide.

Then departure to the Echmiadzin Cathedral (UNESCO World Heritage Site), 20 km from the capital and sacred place of the Christian religion.

On the way back to Yerevan we will visit the ruins of the temple of Zvartnots from the 7th century. Overnight stay.

DAY 3 EREVAN - KHOR VIRAP - NORAVANK - EREVAN

After breakfast, start of the excursion to the Khor Virap Monastery, considered the cradle of civilization and located near the biblical Mount Ararat and the Turkish border. According to history, St. Gregory the Illuminator was imprisoned here for 13 years for preaching Christianity throughout the country. We continue the tour to Vayots Dzor where we will visit the Noravank Monastery, considered one of the most beautiful monasteries in Armenia and an important religious and cultural center

during the 13th century. Return to Yerevan.

DAY 4 EREVAN - GUEGHARD - GARNI - SEVAN

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to Sevan, a high mountain lake at 2000m above sea level. On the way we visit Gueghard and Garni, with photo stop at the Yeghishé Charents Arch, from which you get breathtaking views of Mount Ararat, located in Turkey. Arrival in Gueghard and visit of the monastery carved into the rock during the 12th -13th centuries. Continuation to Garni, where you can enjoy a typical lunch accompanied by "Lavash", Armenian bread baked in a stone oven, and local cheese.

After lunch, visit of a Greco-Roman style temple of the 1stcentury. We continue to Sevan, where we will visit the monastic complex of Sevanavank, of which two medieval churches are preserved. Overnight in Sevan.

DAY 5 SEVAN - SANAHIN - HAGHPAT - SADAKHLO - TBILISI

Today we leave in the direction of Georgia, visiting first the monasteries of Sanahin and Haghpat, in the Tumanian region. Both monasteries, built between the 10th and 13th centuries, are outstanding works of medieval architecture in the country and included in the UNESCO World Heritage List.

Transfer to Sadakhlo, the border between Armenia and Georgia. Arrival at the hotel in Tbilisi where we will stay until the end of the trip and departure point for day trips to the main tourist attractions of the country.

DAY 6 TBILISI

Breakfast at the hotel and departure to visit the capital of Georgia. We start the tour at the church of Metekhi to continue to the Basilica of Anchiskhati, the Great Synagogue and the National Museum of History. On a walking tour we will see the bath houses, Shardeni Street and Meidan Square, which offers a variety of outdoor cafes, galleries and stores. We continue to Rustaveli Avenue, which houses the National Museum of Georgia until we reach the Peace Bridge, one of the most modern buildings in the city, completely made of glass. Afternoon at leisure and overnight.

DAY 7 TBILISI – MTSKHETA - GORI/UPLISTSIKHE - TBILISI

Today's excursion will take us to Mtskheta, where we will visit the 6th century Jvari Monastery and the 11th century Svetitskhoveli Cathedral, both UNESCO World Heritage Sites. We will then drive to the Gori/Uplistsikhe area where we will visit Josef Stalin's birthplace and the cave city.


On the way back to Tbilisi we will stop at the Zhivnali Dam to enjoy the panoramic views, at the Ananuri Fortress and at Pasanauri, where the White Aragvi and Black Aragvi rivers meet. Arrival in Tbilisi and overnight.

DAY 8 TBILISI - GREMI - ALAVERDI - TBILISI

Departure to visit Gremi and Alaverdi. In Gremi we will visit the 16th century fortress located on top of a hill, which offers wonderful views. The monument includes the royal citade


and the church of the Archangels. We will then drive to Kakheti, east of Tbilisi and center of the wine-growing region, where we will visit the 11th century Alaverdi Cathedral, built on the site of an ancient 6th century monastery. Return to Tbilisi and overnight.

DAY 9 TBILISI Breakfast at the hotel and at the indicated time, transfer to the airport.

Rest of the day at leisure to enjoy the city and overnight.

DAY 6 TAMPERE - OULU

Today we will continue our journey north, arriving in the city of Oulu. Overnight in Oulu.

DAY 7 OULU - ROVANIEMI

In past centuries an important center of the timber industry and salmon fishing, Oulu is now home to major Finnish technology companies and a renowned

spa center. We will start the day with a visit to the open-air Turkansaari Museum, which houses up to 27 historic wooden buildings; continuing towards the center we will see the Orthodox Cathedral of the Holy Trinity; the neo-Renaissance Town Hall from 1886 and the Cathedral-Church of Sofia Magdalena from the XVII-XVIII centuries.

We will then head north, arriving in Rovaniemi, gateway to the Arctic Circle and residence of Santa Claus. Upon arrival, free time for lunch and in the afternoon, visit of our Christmas friend's house and certified Arctic crossing. Aurora Borealis - a snowmobile tour in pursuit of the spectacular Northern Lights with their brilliant colors. Ice fishing - learn the ancient Finnish techniques of how to fish on a frozen lake.

DAY 9 ROVANIEMI - Activity Day Second day of fun activities:

SUMMER and AUTUMN (June to September). Floating on ice - experience a unique feeling of entering a frozen lake and floating on it while the sun is still shining at niaht.
